The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of December.

December 1 – Saturday

Simple Assault – Grand Pavilion

Officers responded to a report of two male subjects fighting in the lobby of a local hotel. One of the male subjects stated he was trying to help his intoxicated co-worker back to his room and when he did, the intoxicated subject struck him in the back of the head. At that time, he stated that he struck the intoxicated subject in the face. Neither party wished to be treated for injuries and did not wish to press charges against the other.

Disorderly Conduct – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of three male subjects fighting but were now running towards 10th Avenue. Officers located two of the subjects and determined that they were intoxicated, uncooperative, defensive and belligerent during the investigation. Both subjects were arrested for disorderly conduct with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Harassment – 4000 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that she was being harassed by a subject she had ended a relationship with after two months. The subject continued to leave messages on her voicemail and then started contacting her family and friends telling them she was addicted to crystal meth. The subject would tell them that the Department of Social Services should be contacted because of her small child. The victim indicated that she has seen the subject parked across the street from her residence on several occasions. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Driving Under the Influence – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a local liquor store for a report of a physical disturbance in progress. An officer observed a male subject on a moped with the engine running in front of the store and as the officer exited the patrol vehicle, the male subject attempted to drive away, but was ordered to stop as he fit the description of the subject involved in the disturbance. Further investigation determined that the subject was possibly intoxicated, and the officer requested he complete Standardized Field Sobriety Testing. Upon completion of the testing, the subject was placed under arrest for driving under the

influence and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The subject was charged with DUI 1st, valid moped license required, valid moped registration required and lodged in the Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – 100 Block Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a head-on collision and determined that one of the drivers was possibly intoxicated. During the investigation, the driver admitted to drinking earlier. The driver was transported to MUSC for his injuries. An officer responded to the hospital and upon being able to speak with the driver, advised him that he was under arrest for DUI and a search warrant was issued to obtain a blood and urine sample. The driver was charged with felony DUI, driving on the wrong side of the road, failure to use headlights, and seatbelt violation. Upon release from the hospital, the driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

December 2 – Sunday

Simple Possession Marijuana – J C Long Boulevard

An officer got out with a suspicious person and vehicle parked at a business after it had closed. While speaking with the subject, the officer observed drug paraphernalia sitting on the tool box located in the back of the truck. The officer searched the truck, finding a duffle bag containing approximately 4.2grams of marijuana, a pipe used to smoke marijuana, and a grinder. The subject was charged with simple possession of marijuana, unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia, failure to appear for a previous citation and given a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

December 4 – Tuesday

Livability Offense – 3500 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of illegal dumping in the front yard of a residence. The officer met with the complainant, who provided a description and vehicle license plate for the vehicle that was dumping debris. The officer determined that the vehicle belonged to a landscaping company. The owner of the company admitted to dumping the debris and stated that he thought it was okay. The officer charged him with unlawful dumping on private property with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

December 6 – Thursday

Stolen Property Offenses – IOP Connector

An officer stopped to check on a disabled vehicle with the driver who was waiting for a tow truck. Dispatch advised the officer that the vehicle license plate was reported stolen from Mount Pleasant's jurisdiction. The driver was detained and approximately 1.4grams of crystal meth was found on his person. Further investigation located handgun ammunition and that the driver's license was suspended. The driver was charged with possession of stolen property, lend/borrow/steal license plate, distribution of cocaine-based narcotics – 2nd offense, unlawful possession of ammunition for previous conviction of violent crime, driving under suspension and he was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – 600 Block Carolina Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of a possible intoxicated driver with a child in the vehicle. The officer observed the vehicle pull into the driveway at a residence. Upon contacting the driver, whose pants were wet in the front, appearing that he had urinated it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The child was removed from the area for safety by another officer. The officer requested

that he complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, which he refused. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was charged with driving under the influence, child endangerment and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

December 10 – Monday

Burglary – 32nd Avenue

A victim reported that unknown persons entered the construction site and stole two paint sprayers and three palm sanders. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$1,899. The victim was able to provide serial numbers and the items were entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

December 12 – Wednesday

Forcible Fondling – Sand Dollar Drive

A victim reported an incident that had taken place over the Labor Day Weekend where a male subject inappropriately touched her person. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

December 13 – Thursday

Warrant Arrest – 300 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 45MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. Contact with the driver determined that she had an active warrant with Federal Immigration from 2005. The warrant was confirmed, and the driver was issued citations for speeding, no driver's license and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center with a hold put in place for ICE Law Enforcement.

December 15 – Saturday

Drug Equipment Violations – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was currently suspended. While speaking with the driver, the officer noted a smell of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. The driver indicated that they had smoked it earlier and the only items found in the vehicle by the officer was drug paraphernalia. The driver was charged with driving under suspension – 3rd offense, unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

December 17 – Monday

Grand Larceny – 700 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons stole her trailer that had been left on the property. The approximate value of the stolen trailer is \$8,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

December 18 – Tuesday

Petit Larceny – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that several subjects entered a local convenience store and distracted the sales clerk, going into the storage room where they stole approximately twenty-five cartons of cigarettes. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$2,500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation

December 19 – Wednesday

Identity Theft – Tabby Lane

A victim reported that unknown persons used her identity to open an account with Sprint and she received four packages containing cellular phones. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

December 21 – Friday

Identity Theft – 800 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons used his identity to open credit accounts at various companies. There were purchases made with the unauthorized accounts for approximately \$1,500 and another for \$4,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

December 22 – Saturday

Vandalism of Property – 3500 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons entered his garage area, removed the electric panel and destroyed several circuit breakers. The estimated damaged caused is \$800. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

December 25 – Tuesday

Open Container – 1300 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer observed a vehicle that matched the description of a suspicious vehicle and person in the driving into the parking lot. Contact with the occupant determined that there was an open container of alcoholic beverage sitting in the center console. The occupant was arrested for open container in a motor vehicle and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

December 26 – Wednesday

Identity Theft – Tabby Lane

A victim reported that she was notified by her subscription identity theft company that unknown persons used her identity to open two cell phone accounts and purchase six new cell phones with Sprint. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

December 27 – Thursday

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 100 Block Forest Trail

A victim reported that he had left his handgun in a bag on top of the center console in his unlocked vehicle and upon checking the next morning found it to be gone. The victim was not able to provide a serial number for the weapon at the time the incident report was taken. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

December 29 – Saturday

Burglary – 57th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown persons entered their residence, which is also used as a rental property, and stole items used for decoration inside the home. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$157. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

December 30 – Sunday

Narcotics Violations – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 70MPH in a posted 55MPH speed zone. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was suspended. The driver was arrested and during a search of his person incident to arrest, the officer found 3.4 grams of marijuana. The driver was charged with speeding, driving under suspension – 4th offense, habitual traffic offender and possession of marijuana – 2nd offense. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Community Service Activities / Notable Mentions

During the month of December 2018, Officers issued sixty "Property Security Check Notices" and five "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

December 10 – Detective Louise Hardy, Detective Robert Forsythe and PFC Karina Garica participated in Lunch Buddies with the children at Sullivan's Island Elementary School. They ate lunch with the students, talked about what they are learning in school and the upcoming winter break.

December 20 – Detective Louise Hardy participated in Reading Buddies with the children at the IOP Recreation Department. She read the book "Pigloo" and had snack time.

December 20 – Detective Louise Hardy, Detective Robert Forsythe and Sergeant Matthew Storen assisted Sullivan's Island Elementary School with their wellness board for Smoothie Day. They helped hand out healthy snacks and smoothies to the students.

December 22 – FTO Amanda Postell assisted a resident with the inspection and installation of a child safety seat. Education was completed to ensure that the resident felt comfortable with the proper use of the child safety seat.

December 31 – Detective Sergeant Sharon Baldrick, Sergeant Jamey Meekins, FTO James Couche and PFC Joshua Phillips offered free breath alcohol analyses for patrons at the front beach around the Windjammer. They tested approximately 75 patrons and received positive feedback for providing this service on New Year's Eve.

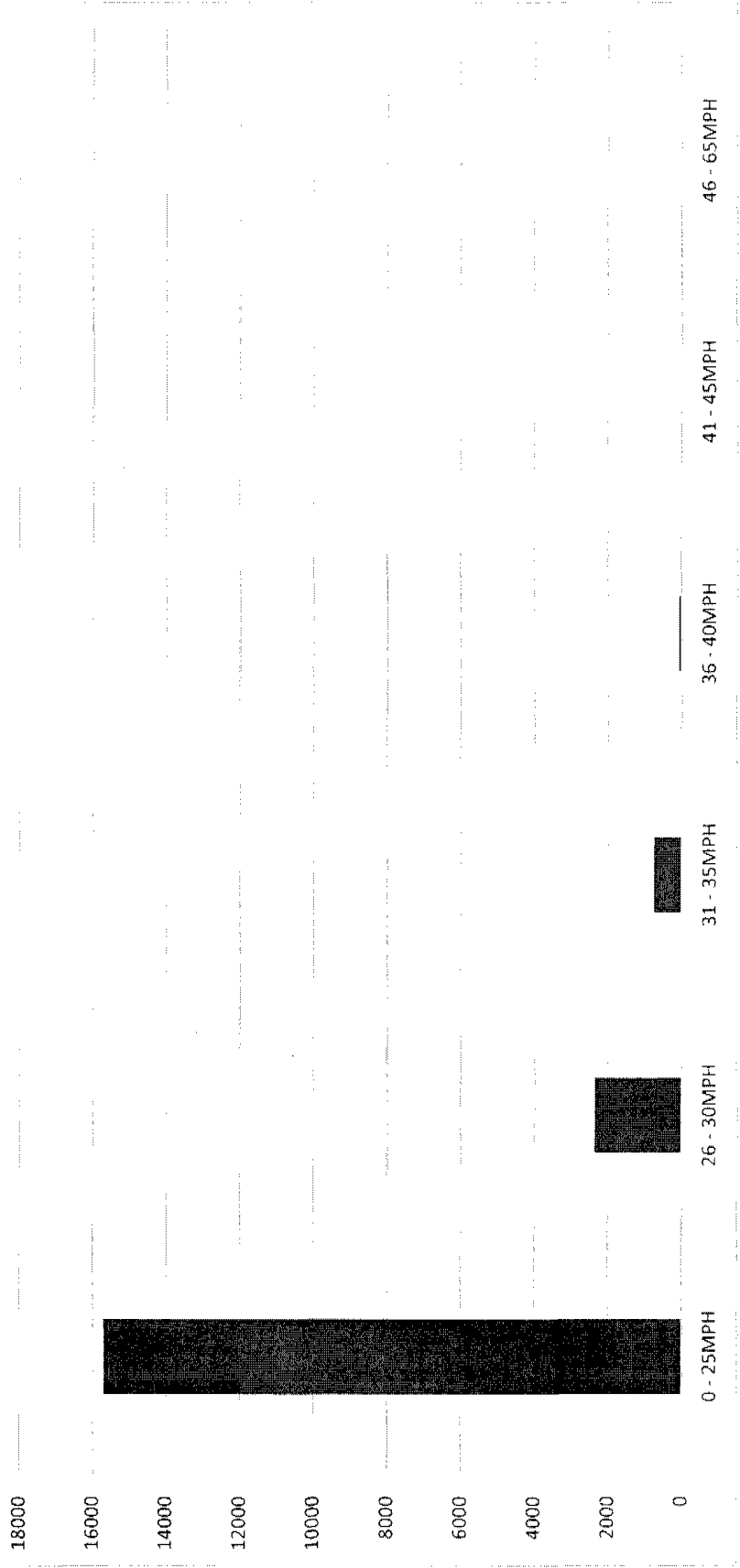

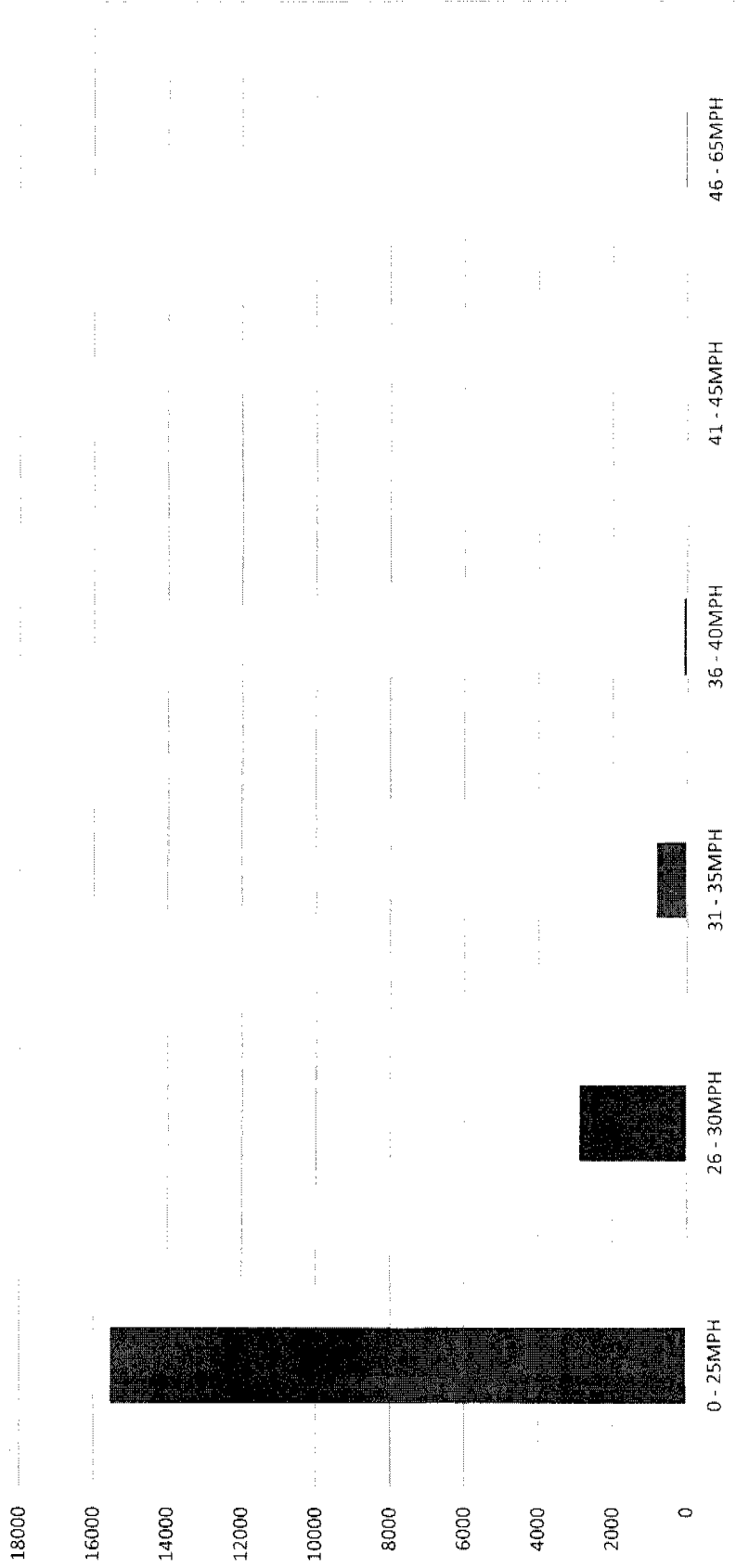

December 2018 - Marginal Side - Outgoing Traffic

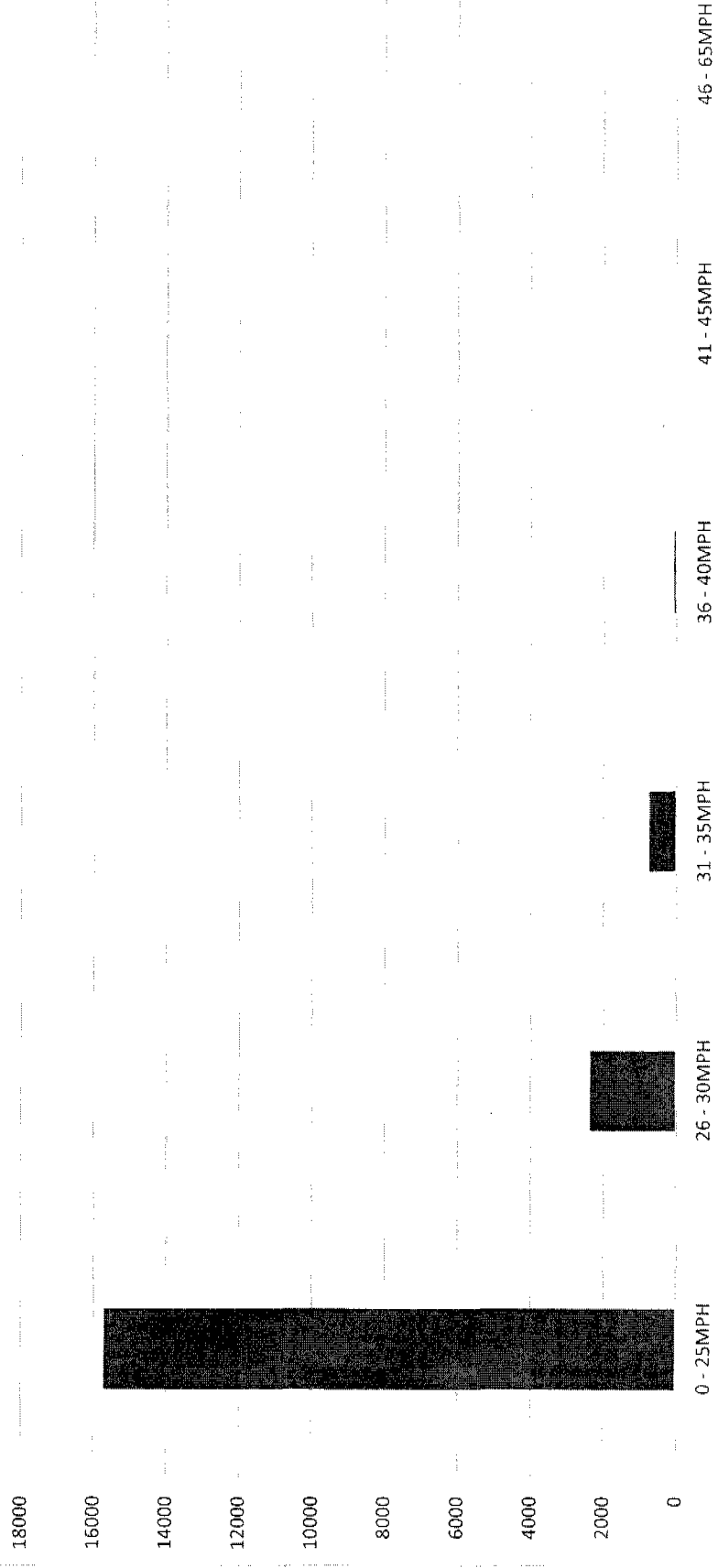

December 2018 - Wildwood Side - Incoming Traffic

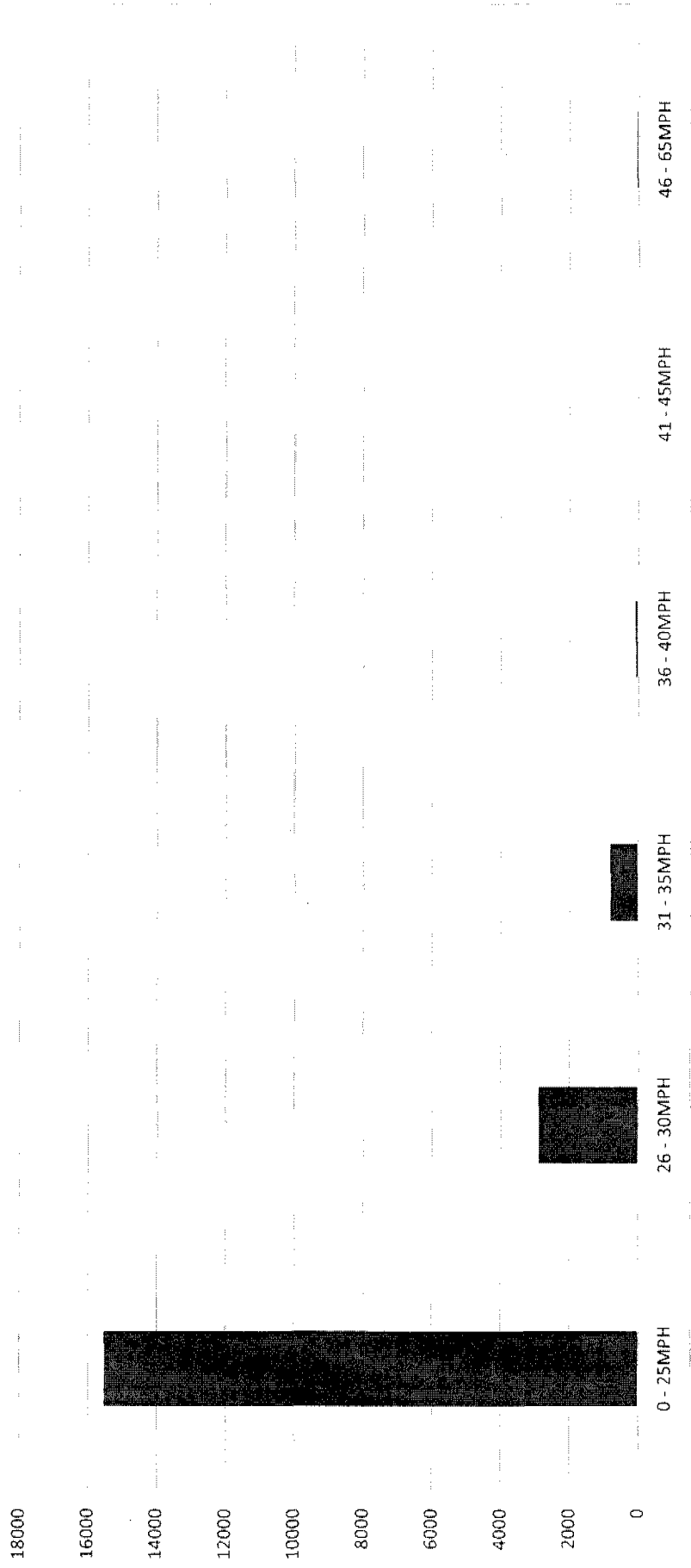
