The following is a synopsis of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of April 2008.

Patrol

April 1, 2008 After stopping a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for a lane violation the officer determined that the driver was wanted by the Douglas County Sheriff's Office in Douglas County, Georgia. When that agency confirmed that they would extradite for their charges, the driver was taken into custody and transported to the Detention Center.

April 6, 2008 An officer responded to the Charleston County Detention Center to serve four Isle of Palms Police Department Arrest Warrants on a female subject that had been arrested in Charleston County. The warrants served were for Breach of Trust w/Fraudulent Intent, Hindering Police, Simple Possession of Marijuana, and Malicious Damage to Personal Property.

April 6, 2008 After stopping a vehicle for a stop sign violation at JC Long Boulevard the officer determined that the driver was wanted by the North Charleston Police Department and Mount Pleasant Police Department. He was taken into custody charged with Disregarding a Stop Sign, DUS, and one count of NRVC and transported to the Detention Center.

April 7, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on 23rd Avenue where a domestic dispute had been reported. Officers determined that the dispute was only verbal in nature with no threats made. The male subject was allowed to leave the area without further incident.

April 7, 2008 Officer's responded to a boat at the Marina on 41st Avenue, where the owner of the boat complained that his former girlfriend would not leave after being asked to do so. A taxicab was called and the girlfriend was transported to a local hotel without further incident.

April 8, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island Police Officer who had arrested two subjects for drug possession after a traffic stop, an officer responded to provide assistance.

April 9, 2008 An officer on patrol of the Connector stopped a vehicle that he observed swerving and crossing the white emergency line several times. The officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol while speaking to the driver, who stated that she had been texting someone on her cellular telephone. Due to the drivers age she was taken into custody and administered a Datamaster Test, which resulted in her being charged with Zero Tolerance and released to a sober driver.

April 11, 2008 At the request of the Mount Pleasant Police Department an officer responded to their headquarters to provide a Datamaster Test to a subject they had in custody charged with DUI.

April 11, 2008 After an officer responded to a Burglary reported on 50th Avenue, Investigators were requested to process the crime scene. The home burglarized was damaged extensively inside with televisions damaged, glasses shattered, photos and personal books destroyed and words written on walls with what appeared to be blood. Smears of blood were visible throughout several rooms. DNA samples were taken as evidence from the residence, which will be compared to a possible suspect. That suspect was served with a Search Warrant to obtain DNA samples for comparison. The investigation is ongoing.

April 11, 2008 A female officer was requested by Investigators of the Charleston County Sheriff's Office who were executing a Search Warrant on Jasper Boulevard on Sullivan's Island.

April 12, 2008 An officer responded to a residence on Oyster Row where a violation of an existing Restraining Order had been reported by the wife involved in a legal separation. The husband was not present and a statement was taken to document the occurrence.

April 12, 2008 At approximately 1:30 A.M., an officer on foot on the front beach observed three subjects walking who appeared to be very unsteady on their feet then get into a vehicle and drive out of a parking lot onto JC Long Boulevard. The officer went to his vehicle and stopped the suspect vehicle to investigate. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed and was then transported to headquarters, where he refused to provide a sample for the Datamaster Test. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

April 13, 2008 Officers responded to a structure fire reported on 25th Avenue and cleared the occupants from the residence. The fire was determined to have been caused by a television cable installer who had accidentally drilled into an electrical line. He was transported to the hospital to be treated for electrical shock.

April 14, 2008 Just before 1 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on the Connector for traveling more than thirty miles an hour over the posted speed limit. The vehicle was stopped on Palm Boulevard near 8th Avenue. While speaking to the driver the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol. Several Field Sobriety Tests were administered, which he failed. He was transported to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test where he registered a .26% level of alcohol, and charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

April 16, 2008 An officer responded to the front beach where someone had reported a male subject carrying beer and throwing objects at passing vehicles. The subject was located on the beach near the boardwalk in the sand dunes pulling flowers out of the dunes. It was determined that the subject was intoxicated and still in possession of a container of beer. He was charged with Public Intoxication, No Alcohol on the Beach, and Destroying Dunes/Sea Oats and transported to the Detention Center.

April 17, 2008 A citizen on a cell phone reported that a male subject in a car traveling toward the Isle of Palms from Sullivan's Island was assaulting a female passenger about the head and shoulders. The citizen stated that she first witnessed the assault on the Ravenel Bridge, which continued through Mount Pleasant and Sullivan's Island. An officer located and made contact with the vehicle in a driveway on the 900 block of Palm Boulevard. The officer placed the female subject into his vehicle for her safety and detained the male subject before he was able to exit his vehicle. The female was determined to be the daughter of the male suspect. A written statement was obtained from the victim and the concerned citizen who reported the incident, and the suspect was arrested and charged with Simple Assault.

April 18, 2008 After stopping a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation the officer made the determination that the driver had a suspended license and was a habitual offender. The three passengers in the vehicle were also found to each have unpaid traffic tickets on their record. After all four subjects were taken into custody a quantity of marijuana claimed by the driver was located in a Mason jar in the vehicle. He was charged with DUS, Operating Uninsured, Simple Possession of Marijuana, and NRVC. One passenger had an active Arrest Warrant from the Summerville Police Department and was also charged with NRVC 7 counts. Two other passengers each had NRVC 3 counts and NRVC 4 counts respectively. All four were transported to the Detention Center.

April 21, 2008 An officer responded to a Waterway Island Drive residence for a welfare check on a suicidal female requested by her doctor. The subject agreed to voluntarily be transported by EMS for commitment.

April 21, 2008 An officer met with the mother of a female juvenile to report that her daughter and her friend had been provided alcohol by a male adult living on 32nd Avenue. The matter was investigated and it was determined that the adult had no knowledge of their alcohol consumption and the juvenile had not been truthful with her mother.

April 23, 2008 After checking the criminal record of a passenger in a vehicle that was stopped for a traffic violation, the officer determined that the subject had an outstanding Arrest Warrant from the Dorchester County Sheriff's Office. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Detention Center until Dorchester County could assume custody.

April 24, 2008 Just after 1 A.M., an officer stopped to investigate a slow moving vehicle on the Connector. When the vehicle came to a stop at the end of the Connector on the Mount Pleasant side, the driver immediately exited the vehicle and ran away on foot to the area of Seaside Farms. A perimeter was immediately set up with officers from adjoining police agencies and the subject was located a short time later in the subdivision behind Seaside Farms and taken into custody without further incident. The officer detected a strong odor of alcohol emitting from the suspect and determined that the nineteen-year-old was impaired. He was transported to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test where he registered a .08% level of alcohol. He was charged with Zero Tolerance, Impeding the Flow of Traffic, Violation of a Beginner's Permit, and Malicious Damage to Property.

April 26, 2008 An officer on patrol of the Connector followed a speeding vehicle onto Palm Boulevard, where it was stopped near 21st Avenue. The officer observed an open can of beer while speaking to the driver then conducted several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed. The driver was then transported to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test and refused to provide a sample. The subject was charged with DUI and Open Container and transported to the Detention Center.

April 26, 2008 Officers responded to 42nd Avenue where someone reported a suspicious parked vehicle. Officers located the vehicle and detected the odor of freshly burned marijuana. The officers walked down to the beach and approached several subjects smoking. An officer observed a silver colored pipe commonly used to smoke marijuana and a bag of marijuana next to the subjects. The subjects stated that they had just been in the vehicle that the officers had checked. Two adult females were charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana and the male subject was determined to be a juvenile. He was charged as well, but his case will be handled in Family Court. He was released to the custody of a parent. Prior to towing the vehicle, an additional quantity of marijuana was located.

April 27, 2008 Just before 2 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for speeding and while speaking to the driver immediately detected an odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. The driver had slurred speech and a difficult time providing the

proper paperwork to the officer. The driver was given several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed. He was transported to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test where he refused to provide a sample. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

April 27, 2008 While on patrol in Wild Dunes an officer stopped a vehicle that he observed fail to stop for a stop sign on Back Bay Drive. The female driver presented a suspended license and was taken into custody. A male passenger was then found to be in possession of a quantity of marijuana and several pills that were a controlled substance. He too was taken into custody and charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Controlled Substance. Both were transported to the Detention Center.

Personnel/Community Relations

April 2, 2008 Chief Buckhannon, Sergeant O'Donnell and Sergeant Usry attended a Keenagers Meeting at the Recreation Center. A power-point presentation was narrated by Chief Buckhannon.

April 1, 2008 ACO Cook received a congratulatory letter from Mayor Sottile for winning a Municipal Association of South Carolina Achievement Award for the Bark Park at the Recreation Center.

April 6, 2008 PFC Baldrick properly installed a child safety seat and demonstrated to an island resident the correct placement and installation of the seat.

April 18, 2008 PFC Hicks spoke to a group of pre-school children at the Recreation Department regarding the importance of seatbelts and 911.

April 20, 2008 Eleven Officers and other support personnel provided traffic control and security for the annual East Cooper Triathlon.

April 25, 2008 Ptl. James Stanko graduated from the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy. Chief Buckhannon and Lieutenant Wright attended and Sergeant Ryan played the bagpipes for the opening ceremony of the graduation.

April 26, 2008 Twelve officers and other support personnel provided traffic control and security for the annual Taste of the Islands held on Ocean Boulevard.

April 30, 2008 For the month of April, officers on patrol discovered four businesses and one home with open or unsecured doors. A total of one hundred and eight Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or property owners for various violations noted by officers on patrol.

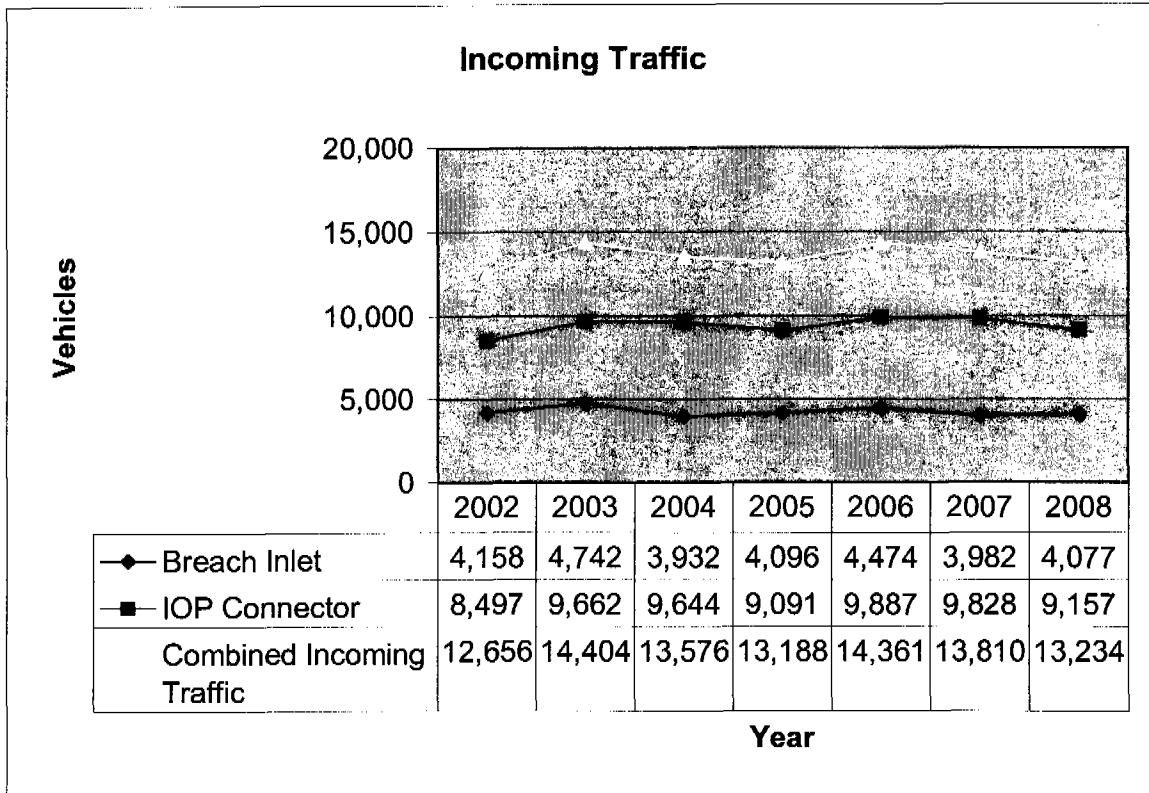

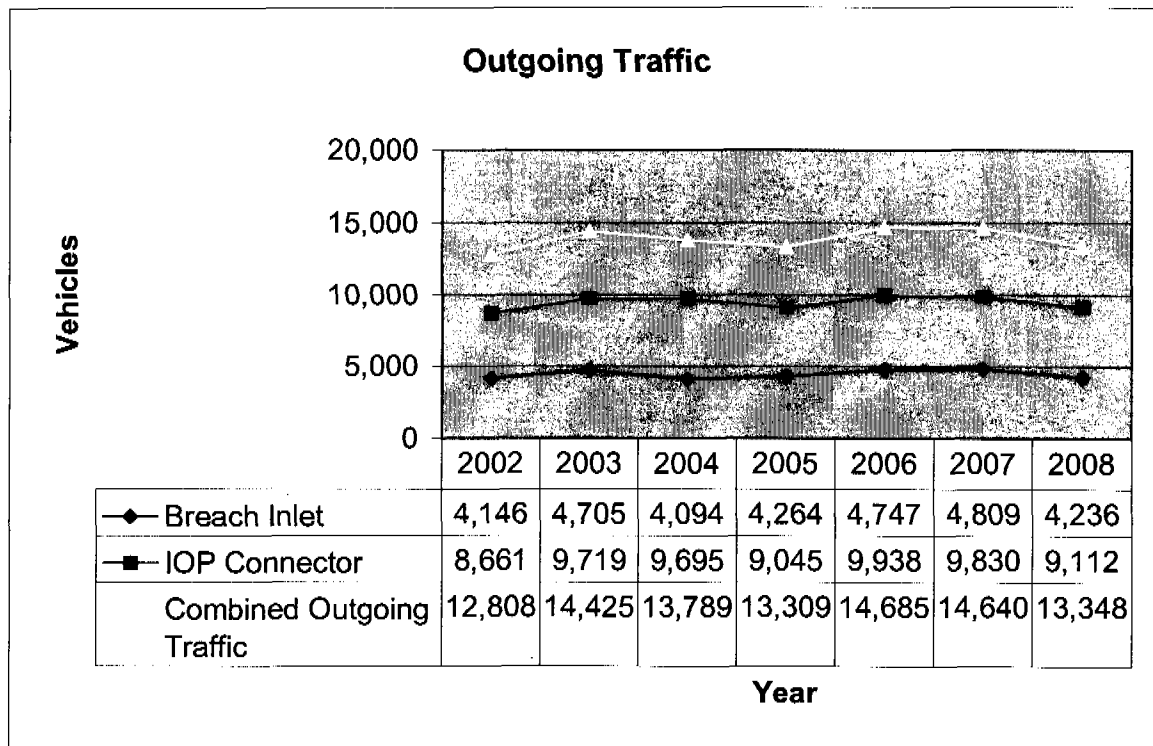
