The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of August 2010.

Patrol

August 5, 2010 An officer on patrol on the Connector observed a vehicle traveling in front of the patrol vehicle weaving across the right fog line several times and stopped the vehicle to investigate. While speaking to the driver, the officer detected an odor of alcohol from the vehicle. When asked about alcohol consumption, the male driver admitted that he had consumed at least two drinks while in Mount Pleasant. Several Field Sobriety Tests were administered with poor results, and the driver was taken into custody. When the driver was administered a Datamaster Test, he registered a .18% level of alcohol and was charged with DUI then lodged in the Detention Center.

August 7, 2010 Just after 1 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation. The driver advised the officer that he did not have his driver's license with him and then proceeded to provide the officer with his brother's personal information. The driver was taken into custody when it was determined that his license had been suspended for the third time. Located in the vehicle were several beer cans cool to the touch and an open bottle of brandy. A closer check of the vehicle indicated that it had been reported stolen in Mount Pleasant earlier the previous day. The driver was charged with DUS 3rd offense, Illegal Transport of Legal Liquor, Hindering, Open Container, and then transported to the Detention Center. The vehicle was towed, and the Mount Pleasant Police Department charged the subject with Grand Larceny of a Motor Vehicle.

August 7, 2010 An officer responded to the Marina on 41st Avenue where an employee pointed out a male subject loading property that did not belong to him into a vehicle from a storage shed. An investigation into the incident resulted in the arrest of the male subject for stealing a weed-eater and some electrical tools belonging to two separate victims. The subject was charged with two counts of Petit Larceny. All of the stolen property was recovered and returned to the rightful owner.

August 7, 2010 An officer on foot patrol near the pool area at Grand Pavilion in Wild Dunes observed several subjects consuming alcohol and appearing to be under the age of twenty-one. The three male subjects were identified as being sixteen years old were taken into custody charged with Underage Possession of Beer and released to the custody of their parents, who responded from Mount Pleasant. Their cases will be heard in Family Court.

August 8, 2010 An officer on foot patrol near the pool area at Grand Pavilion in Wild Dunes observed two subjects who appeared to be younger than twenty-one years of age consuming beer and vodka at poolside. Both subjects were charged with Underage Possession of Alcohol.

August 11, 2010 An officer met a Mount Pleasant police officer, who had requested assistance for jurisdiction with an Arrest Warrant he had for an employee of a local restaurant. The officers went to the business and took the female subject into custody without incident.

August 12, 2010 Officers responded to a JC Long Boulevard establishment where management reported that an intoxicated male patron had threatened employees and other patrons with a small knife. When the officers arrived, they were advised that the subject had left on foot in the direction of Ocean Boulevard. Several minutes later an officer located a male subject matching the description of the subject on 10th Avenue. The subject admitted that he had just left the bar and was in possession of a small pocket-knife. An officer checked with management who declined to pursue charges for the threats made, but just wanted the subject placed on Trespass Notice. The subject was taken into custody, charged with Public Intoxication and placed on Trespass Notice.

August 13, 2010 Just after midnight, an officer on foot patrol in the Front Beach business district was advised by an employee of a nearby establishment that a female was urinating in their elevator. The subject was identified as a 20 year old with false identification. Her companion, her female cousin, was the same age also produced false identification. Both subjects were charged with Underage Possession of Alcohol and Possession of False Identification.

August 13, 2010 Just after 1 A.M., officers responded to an Ocean Boulevard residence, where both persons present admitted that they had consumed approximately 1 and ½ grams of cocaine and felt as though they were going to overdose. Both were treated by Fire Department personnel and transported by EMS to a local hospital for treatment.

August 13, 2010 At the request of Fire Department personnel who were at a residence on 24th Avenue to provide medical assistance, an officer responded to assist in having the sick family member transported for her medical issue. The patient had apparently also consumed alcohol, which escalated her medical condition. The patient was transported to the hospital without further incident.

August 14, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on 25th Avenue where the resident had requested that several intoxicated persons were refusing to leave. After speaking to several parties present at the residence, two female subjects were taken into custody charged with Assault. Witnesses stated that the two females fought with each other, which required that they be pulled apart and would not leave the residence when requested by the owner.

August 15, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on the Connector for an equipment violation. While speaking with the driver the officer observed several open bottles of liquor in plain view. The driver was cited for Illegal Transport of Legal Liquor and Defective Equipment.

August 16, 2010 Officers responded to a Sea Horse Court residence to assist Fire Department personnel in a medical assist call. The officer determined that an intoxicated male subject had fallen down the steps to the garage while attempting to lower the garage door. The victim sustained a fractured arm and was transported to MUSC for treatment.

August 16, 2010 Just after 1 A.M., officers responded to the beach behind the Windjammer where a female subject at that location stated she had been assaulted. The female stated that she was walking the beach with friends and told a male subject who began walking with the group to leave them alone; he responded by grabbing her and slamming her into the water and holding her down. None of her friends present could corroborate the story, and all were determined to be under the influence of alcohol. The victim was advised accordingly.

August 16, 2010 A male subject walked into the Public Safety Building just before 8 A.M. to report an act of Criminal Domestic Violence against him by his wife. He drove to the Police Department in his pajamas after his wife assaulted him and locked him out of their Forest Trail residence. Statements were taken, and photographs taken of the subject. A short time later, officers went to the residence and placed the victims wife under arrest for Criminal Domestic Violence.

August 17, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on the Connector for speeding and determined that the driver worked for housekeeping in Wild Dunes. The officer observed numerous items in plain view that appeared to belong to his employer. Contact was made with the manager on duty, who responded and assumed custody of all of the items. The driver was charged with Speeding and Failure to Transfer Ownership.

August 18, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation on JC Long Boulevard and after running a computer check, the officer determined his license to be suspended. The driver was given a warning for the equipment violation and was charged with DUS 1st offense.

August 21, 2010 An officer responded to Nason Medical Center in Mount Pleasant to investigate an assault to a sixteen year old female that occurred on the Isle of Palms. The officer determined that her mother's boyfriend, while cleaning a rental property on 31st Avenue, assaulted the victim. Contact was made with the victim's mother, who refused to accept responsibility or to assume custody of her daughter. The victim was eventually taken into Emergency Protective Custody and turned over to a representative of the Department of Social Services, who after interviewing several family members, allowed the victim to depart with a friend of the family. An Investigator will conduct a follow-up investigation into the assault.

August 22, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle for a series of moving violations he he witnessed on Palm Boulevard. After conducting several Field Sobriety Tests to insure that the driver was not impaired, the officer charged the driver with Reckless Driving and allowed her to go home with a family member.

August 24, 2010 Just before 10 P.M., an officer on patrol on 29th Avenue near Cameron Boulevard observed a golf cart operating without headlights or taillights and stopped to advise the operator. Both adult female occupants were in possession of cups of liquor, as well as a large bottle of vodka in a plastic bag between them. Both subjects were cited for Illegal Transportation of Legal Liquor, and the liquor was destroyed.

August 27, 2010 At approximately 2 A.M., an officer on patrol was alerted by a citizen of a reckless driver on the Connector; the citizen stated an SUV was tailgating him then passed him in the median. The officer located the vehicle and stopped it as it turned on 30th Avenue. The officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol while speaking to the driver, who admitted he had consumed several alcoholic drinks and submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests. After the drivers poor performance, he was taken into custody and transported to headquarters for a Datamaster Test where he registered a .16% level of alcohol in his system. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

August 27, 2010 A citizen reported that, while attempting to make a purchase on his bank debit card at a restaurant in Mount Pleasant, his card was declined. After making contact with his bank, he discovered that at least four unauthorized purchases totaling more than \$900 had been made. It was determined that the card had been cloned and the numbers fraudulently used to make the purchases.

August 27, 2010 After stopping a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation, the officer determined that the driver had a suspended license stemming from a 2008 DUI charge; the driver was also in possession of a bottle of rum. He was taken into custody charged with DUS1st and Illegal Transportation of Legal Liquor.

August 28, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for failing to stop at a stop sign at JC Long Boulevard & Palm Boulevard. While speaking to the driver, the passenger repeatedly interrupted and answered questions that were directed to the driver. After checking the passenger's record the officer determined that his license was suspended for failure to pay tickets, was taken into custody and placed in the rear seat of the police vehicle. The driver was charged with Careless Operation and Open Container. The passenger then began to yell profanities; when the officer opened the rear door to speak with him, he attempted to jump from the vehicle. A second officer pulled the subject back into the vehicle from the opposite side rear door. He was charged with two counts of NRVC and Resisting Arrest.

August 30, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard near 29th Avenue for an equipment violation and while speaking to the driver determined that she had no license in her possession. The driver then provided a false name and date of birth to the officer for identification. The driver was taken into custody for no driver's license in her possession. A second officer arrived on scene and recognized the driver to be someone other than the name she provided. A drug K-9 from the Charleston County Sheriff's Office was requested and responded. The K-9 walked around the vehicle and detected something in the trunk of the vehicle, where a quantity of cocaine was located. The driver was charged with DUS, Possession of Cocaine, and Hindering then transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

August 31, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a truck on Palm Boulevard for not having a warning flag on an object protruding more than four feet from the bed. A computer check of the driver indicated that he was wanted for Burglary by the Charleston County Sheriff's Office. The warrant was confirmed and a Charleston County Deputy assumed custody.

Personnel/Community Relations

August 3, 2010 Beach Services Officer K'Hill Lesemann received a Letter of Appreciation from his Supervisor for actions he recently took while off-duty. BSO Lesemann observed two male subjects steal a Road Closed sign from Palm Boulevard & 41st Avenue then followed them until a police officer was able to stop and arrest them.

August 6, 2010 PFC Chavez received a Letter of Appreciation from the Project Coordinator of the 9th Judicial Circuit Solicitors Office of Community Response to Domestic Violence thanking him for his valuable input at a recent focus group meeting of officers from all area law enforcement agencies.

August 31, 2010 For the month of August, officers discovered four businesses and four homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of fifty-three Victim of Crime Forms were issued to homeowners for various violations noted, and ninety-two Property Security Check Forms to advise business or homeowners that an officer checked their property during the night.
