The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of February 2010.

Patrol

February 2, 2010 Just before 4 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. While speaking to the driver the officer determined that the license plate was expired and the driver had a suspended license. The driver was taken into custody, charged with DUS and Failure to Surrender a Suspended License Plate.

February 2, 2010 After an officer stopped a vehicle on the Connector for an equipment violation the officer made the determination that the driver was operating the vehicle while suspended for a previous DUI. The driver was taken into custody and charged with DUS and No Proof of Insurance.

February 4, 2010 An officer responded to a hit and run accident on Waterway Island Drive, where a van struck a legally parked vehicle then left the scene without stopping. A witness was able to provide a description of the vehicle, which was a van with business markings. The van was located and the driver charged with Leaving the Scene of an Accident.

February 7, 2010 An officer responded to a front beach establishment where a fight in progress had been reported. Upon the officers arrival restaurant personnel had the suspect detained. The suspect appeared to be highly intoxicated and was placed in the rear seat of a police vehicle where he then had to be further restrained after attempting to kick out the rear window of the vehicle. The victim, an employee of the restaurant stated that while emptying trashcans that contained beer bottles, the suspect deliberately kicked a can over. The employee went to grab another can before it could be kicked over and while doing so the suspect rushed him from behind shattering a beer bottle over his head

then placing the victim in a choke hold wrestling him to the ground. Other employees came to assist and restrained the suspect until police arrived. The suspect was charged with Disorderly Conduct and Assault and Battery of a High an Aggravated Nature.

February 7, 2010 An Isle of Palms police officer responded to Sullivan's Island at their request to assist their officers with a disturbance at a residence on Brownell Boulevard.

February 8, 2010 Just before midnight, an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard near 10th Avenue for speeding. While speaking to the driver the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. When the driver was asked to exit the vehicle he had trouble standing without support. He submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed, and was taken into custody. After being administered the Datamaster Test the driver registered a .12% level of alcohol and was charged with DUI.

February 9, 2010 An officer responded to a residence on Ocean Boulevard where a caretaker for the property encountered an intoxicated male subject in the yard. When questioned by the officer the suspect stated that he lived at an address on 6th Avenue, which did not exist. The subject was taken into custody charged with Trespassing on Another's Land and Public Intoxication.

February 10, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped to investigate two illegally parked vehicles on Intercoastal Court. The officers were able to get the attention of the drivers of each vehicle from a nearby residence. While speaking to the operator of one vehicle the officer observed marijuana in plain view in the ashtray. While the driver obtained the vehicle paperwork from the glove compartment he grabbed the marijuana and attempted to conceal it. While placing the subject in custody he managed to place the marijuana in his mouth. The subject was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana and Hindering Police.

February 14, 2010 Officers responded to a Front Beach establishment to check on the welfare of an intoxicated female subject who passed out on the steps of the business. Due to the subjects extreme state of intoxication Fire Department First Responders were called to evaluate. While attempting to provide assistance to the subject an intoxicated male subject interfered several times then became combative. He was taken into custody and charged with Public Intoxication. The female subject was transported to a local hospital for observation.

February 14, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on 27th Avenue, where an assault had been reported. Officers met with the female victim, who stated that while making breakfast for her boyfriend he became enraged and attacked her by throwing her down and pinning her to the floor with his knee, then slamming her head repeatedly into the floor. She managed to escape to a neighbor's residence where she called the police. The male suspect was located walking on the next street. He was positively identified and charged with Simple Assault. EMS provided medical assistance to the victim then transported her to a local hospital.

February 15, 2010 At the request of The Mount Pleasant Police Department, an officer went to a residence on Carolina Boulevard to check on the welfare of a male subject at that location, who had indicated by e-mail to that agency that he wanted to harm himself. The subject was located and determined to be competent to care for himself.

February 15, 2010 Officers responded to a Carolina Boulevard residence where a friend reported a possible drug overdose. A female subject smoked what was described as a marijuana alternative and became extremely sick. The substance was determined not to be marijuana, but was clearly labeled not for human consumption. EMS arrived and transported the subject to East Cooper Medical Center.

February 18, 2010 Officers responded to a residence on Hartnett Boulevard where the owner reported that two safes at the residence had been forced open and items removed. The owner stated that the residence was in the process of being remodeled and had not been occupied since October when the construction began. Cash, bonds, coins and jewelry was reported missing. The incident has been assigned to an Investigator.

February 21, 2010 Just after 1:30 A.M., officers responded to the 200 block of Carolina Boulevard, where an auto pedestrian accident had been reported. The officer determined that a vehicle had struck a male subject walking his dogs in the street. The impact caused minor injuries to the pedestrian, who was transported by EMS for evaluation. The vehicle sustained a cracked windshield. It was determined that the driver of the vehicle was traveling under the prescribed speed limit and changed direction to avoid hitting the dogs, but struck the pedestrian who was walking near the center of the roadway. The driver was not charged.

February 21, 2010 Just after 4 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped to investigate a suspicious vehicle parked in a driveway on Carolina Boulevard that he had observed earlier in the evening. The vehicle had fogged windows and was occupied by a male and a female subject who were sleeping. Both subjects stated they were from the Summerville area and had pulled into the driveway to rest. Both subjects were charged with No Sleeping in Vehicle.

February 23, 2010 While conducting stationary radar enforcement in the 5100 block of Palm Boulevard, an officer stopped a vehicle and after running the drivers information in the computer determined that he was wanted by the Mount Pleasant Police Department. He was taken into custody for the outstanding Arrest Warrant and charged with NRVC x 2 for two unpaid traffic tickets, Tags Registered to Another Vehicle, and DUS.

February 24, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for driving erratically and when the officer approached the driver he was holding a cellular telephone, which he had been using while driving. A check of the vehicles license indicated that it was not

properly registered. The driver was charged with Failure to Register Motor Vehicle within 45 Days, No Proof of Ownership, and Operating an Uninsured Motor Vehicle.

February 27, 2010 Just before 10 P.M., an officer was waiting for a tow truck to tow a vehicle from the 800 block of Palm Boulevard when someone nearby threw a soda bottle full of liquid which landed in the street in front of his vehicle. Once the tow truck driver arrived a second bottle containing liquid was again thrown in the officer's direction. Other officers were summoned and the suspect was located nearby and taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct and Littering.

February 28, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped to investigate a suspicious vehicle parked on the side of the road on Carolina Boulevard, which was occupied by two female subjects. When the officer approached the vehicle he immediately observed the passenger holding a quantity of what appeared to marijuana. The passenger then attempted to discard the marijuana on the floorboard of the vehicle. Both subjects were removed from the vehicle and additional marijuana was located. Both subjects were taken into custody and charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana.

Personnel/Community Relations

February 2, 2010 Sgt. Ambas received a Letter of Appreciation from Chief Buckhannon recognizing his performance as the police departments Community Services Officer.

February 3, 2010 PFC Thompson and ACO Keelan received a letter of appreciation from a resident who complimented them for their professionalism in the way they handled her complaint of an issue with some dogs on the beach near her residence.

February 5, 2010 At the request of the Basic Training Director of the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy, Sgt. Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipe for the graduation ceremony of Basic Law Enforcement Class 548.

February 11, 2010 Sgt. Caldwell, Det. Tarr, and Ptl. Swain provided a Law Enforcement Demonstration to a local Cub Scout Pack. The officers assisted with a mock crime scene then allowed the scouts to participate in processing the scene. The scouts also participated in being fingerprinted themselves. McGruff the Crime Dog also attended the event. The Charleston County Sheriff's Office provided a demonstration of their remote controlled bomb-handling robot.

February 28, 2010 For the month of February, officers discovered five businesses and eight homes with open or unsecured doors, A total of six hundred twenty Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or homeowners for various violations noted, or to advise them that an officer checked their property during the night.
