The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of May, 2011.

## Patrol

(May 1: Sunday)

A victim reported that sometime between 04/25/11 and 04/27/11, unknown person(s) went into several of his unlocked vehicles, which were parked in the drive of his Dunes Boulevard residence. The perpetrators stole several electronics and a quantity of cash. This case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

A victim reported that her ex-boyfriend damaged her daughter's vehicle. The estimated costs of the damages are \$200.00. This case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(May 2: Monday)

At approximately 11:20 p. m., an Officer observed a vehicle being operated in the 3000 block of Palm Boulevard, with a number of equipment violations. While behind the suspect vehicle, the Officer further observed the driver make several turns without signaling, disregard a stop sign, and two individuals sitting in the bed of the pick-up truck consuming alcoholic beverages. The Officer conducted a traffic stop upon the vehicle, at which time the driver immediately exited the vehicle and began walking away. When ordered to return to the vehicle, the Officer observed the driver to be unsteady on his feet. While speaking with the same, the Officer, also, observed a strong smell of alcoholic beverage emitting from the driver's person, his inability to stand without swaying or speak without slurring his words. The driver was unable to produce his driver's license. Subjects were charged accordingly.

An Officer conducted a traffic stop in reference to equipment violations. During the preliminary investigation, it was determined that the license plate for the vehicle was suspended for failure to obtain insurance. The driver was placed under arrest and charged with Driving Under Suspension, No Insurance and Suspended License Plate.

(May 3: Tuesday)

At approximately 8:00 a. m., an Officer conducted a traffic stop upon a vehicle for speeding. It was learned that the driver of the vehicle had an outstanding bench warrant and a suspended driver's license. The subject was charged accordingly.

(May 4: Wednesday)

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his unlocked vehicle, which was parked in the driveway of his 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue residence, and stole a number of prescription medications and a Magellan GPS unit. This case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

Officers were dispatched to a front beach business in reference to a shoplifting. An employee of the business reported that two white males, appearing to be mid-twenties, stole a water raft from the store; thereafter, departed the area in a white in color Lexus SUV.

(May 9: Monday)

Officers were dispatched to a verbal dispute in progress. Prior to arrival, the two subjects that were engrossed in the argument left the residence. Shortly thereafter, Officers located the subject vehicle and made contact with the two occupants. The driver of the vehicle advised Officers that he did not have a driver's license and provided false information to the Officers when providing his name and date of birth, on at least four occasions. The passenger provided the driver's correct information, at which time it was learned that the driver had an active, outstanding warrant out of the North Charleston Police Department. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Detention Center.

(May 11: Wednesday)

Officers met with the victim who wanted to report that on or about 04/28/11, several individuals entered into his unlocked vehicle and stole a pair of sunglasses.

The victim reported to Officers that unknown person(s) entered onto his property and stole a bicycle from the front yard of his residence.

(May 13: Friday)

The victim reported that she received a number of telephone calls from an unknown individual, identifying himself as an Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Agent. The perpetrator accused the victim of illegal drug possession and arrest unless she paid an instant fine of \$1,300. The victim contacted the FDA, at which time she was advised that the telephone calls were not from their agency.

(May 14: Saturday)

An unknown subject entered an Ocean Boulevard residence through an unsecured front door and removed the keys to the victim's SUV, which was parked in the driveway of the residence. Thereafter, stole the vehicle. The vehicle was involved in an accident on Rivers Avenue, in North Charleston, after attempting to flee law enforcement officers. The perpetrator was transported to the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) to be treated for his injuries. The subject has pending Isle of Palms Police Department warrants for Burglary and Grand Larceny of a Motor Vehicle, in addition to a number of Charleston County Sheriff's Office charges. The subject will be taken into custody upon his release from MUSC.

(May 15: Sunday)

At approximately 2:12 am, Officers responded to the 200 block of Charleston Boulevard in reference to an assault that had just occurred. Upon arrival, Officers made contact with the victim and a taxi driver. The cab driver advised Officers that she had picked up two males from Market Street, downtown Charleston; both of whom requested to be transported to the Isle of Palms. The victim and the perpetrator did not know each other, however, decided to share the fare to the island. While en route to the Isle of Palms, a verbal altercation occurred between the victim and an unknown white male. The unknown white male struck the victim in the mouth, with a closed fist, and fled the scene on foot.

(May 16: Monday)

An Officer met with an Ocean Boulevard resident who had called to report that unknown person(s) had entered her property and stole four decorative landscaping lights.

At approximately 10:47 am an Officer traveling onto the Isle of Palms Connector, from Palm Boulevard, was almost struck by a vehicle that failed to yield the right of way. A lawful traffic stop was conducted, at which time it was discovered that the driver of the vehicle did not have a valid driver's license and had an outstanding bench warrant for Failure to Pay a Traffic Fine.

In the afternoon, on the same date, an Officer observed a golf cart disregard a stop sign while traveling on Forest Trail. The golf cart was occupied by two minors, who were found to be in possession of alcoholic beverages. Both subjects were detained and charged accordingly.

At approximately 7:52 pm, an Officer conducted a traffic stop upon a vehicle that was driving at a high rate of speed in the 700 block of Palm Boulevard. While speaking with the driver of the vehicle, the Officer observed a strong smell of alcoholic beverage emitting from within the vehicle, while simultaneously observing a bottle of liquor with a broken seal, lying on the floor behind the passenger's seat. It was discovered that the passenger of the vehicle was under the age of 21 and had in his possession a fake driver's license. The driver was charged with Reckless Driving and Transfer of Liquor to a Minor. The passenger was charged with Underage Possession of Liquor and Possession of a False Identification Card.

Visitors to the Isle of Palms reported that they had left their rental condominium for dinner and returned to find that unknown person(s) had stolen a bottle of prescription medication. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(May 17: Tuesday)

At approximately 8:00 pm, while on route patrol of the front beach area, an Officer was approached by a business owner in reference to a suspicious person. Additional Officers arrived on scene and located a white female who was behaving in a suspicious manner. While speaking with the subject, she could not answer questioned posed by Officers, nor could she provide any information as to where she lived, where she had come from or how she got to the Isle of Palms. The subject displayed characteristics similar to those associated with schizophrenia; to include delusions of grandeur and paranoia. The subject was transported to the Medical University of South Carolina hospital for a voluntary psychiatric evaluation.

During late evening hours, unknown person(s) entered a locked construction trailer and took, and carried away a quantity of power tools. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(May 18: Wednesday)

A victim reported that he had parked his bicycle in front of his residence for a short amount of time and when he returned, observed it to be missing.

(May 20: Friday)

A victim reported to the Isle of Palms Public Safety Building to meet with an Officer to report that several pieces of jewelry were stolen from her rental property on or about 05/17/11. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

An Officer met with a victim at the 21st Avenue beach access in reference to a theft. The victim reported that she had left her items unattended on the beach, to go for a short walk. Upon her return, her items had been stolen.

(May 21: Saturday)

An Officer conducted a traffic stop, on the Isle of Palms Connector at approximately 3:00 am. After the driver of the vehicle was unable to successfully perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tasks, he was placed under arrest. During a search of his person, prior to transport to the Detention Center, a quantity of marijuana and a pipe commonly used to smoke marijuana was located in his pocket.

(May 23: Monday)

The victim reported that sometime between 04/24/11 and 05/08/11, unknown persons stole an antique sugar and creamer set from within her residence. This case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(May 24: Tuesday)

An Officer conducting foot patrol of the front beach area observed a male subject that appeared to be under the age of 21, consuming an alcoholic beverage. Identification presented to the Officer confirmed the subject was underage. Consequently, the subject was charged with Minor in Possession of Alcohol and No Alcohol on Streets.

(May 25: Wednesday)

At approximately 10:11 p. m., while conducting route patrol in the 1100 block of Ocean Boulevard, an Officer observed a white female yelling at vehicles in an attempt to get someone to stop so that she could ask for a ride to her residence in Mount Pleasant. A National Crime Information Center (NCIC) and South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles (SCDMV) check of her information revealed three active bench warrants, all for Failure to Pay a Traffic Fine. The female subject was taken into custody and charged accordingly.

(May 26: Thursday)

An Officer was dispatched to the 2200 block of Palm Boulevard, in reference to vandalism of a vehicle. The victim advised the Officer that unknown person(s) had written profanity on the passenger side door window, using shoe polish. Further, the victim informed the Officer of an on-going dispute between her teenaged daughter and a classmate; however, could not be certain that the classmate was the perpetrator of this incident.

At approximately 11:28 p. m., Officers were dispatched to a residence on 20th Avenue in reference to a physical altercation in progress. Upon arrival on scene, Officers met with a female subject who stated

that she and her boyfriend had engaged in a verbal argument that escalated into a physical altercation. The male subject had fled the scene on foot prior to the arrival of responding Officers, and was never located. The female stated that she did not wish to pursue charges, nor did she require medical treatment. She was advised by an Officer that the homeowners no longer wanted her on the property, at which time she departed the scene.

(May 28: Saturday)

Officers conducting foot patrol of the front beach area observed several white male subjects sleeping on benches, both of whom were intoxicated. One of the subjects became irate when awakened and the second subject was unable to provide any information to the Officers. Both were placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

A guest of Oceanside Villas reported that unknown person(s) stole two bicycles, which the victim had stored on the walkway.

**Personnel/Community Relations**

An Officer played the bagpipes at the 2011 Tri-County Fraternal Order of Police, Law Enforcement Officer Memorial service in North Charleston.

May 31, 2011. For the month of May, officers discovered 41 businesses and 16 homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of 57 Victim of Crime Forms or Property Security Check Forms were issued to business or homeowners for various violations noted. Or to advise that an officer checked their property during the night while on patrol.

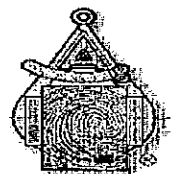
