Date: February 1, 2012

The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of January, 2011.

(January 4: Wednesday)

While on route patrol in the 100 block of Palm Boulevard, an Officer observed a vehicle that appeared to be traveling at a speed higher than the posted 35 mph. After confirming a speeding violation, the Officer conducted a traffic stop upon the vehicle. During interview with the operator of the vehicle, it was learned that the insurance had expired. The driver/owner was charged accordingly.

An Officer traveling outbound on the Isle of Palms Connector observed the vehicle traveling in front of him swerve outside of the distinguished lane of travel numerous times. A check of the license plate through the South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicle (SCDMV) database produced information that the owner of the vehicle's driver's license was suspended for failure to maintain insurance on the vehicle. After a traffic stop was conducted and an interview was conducted with the operator, the same was placed under arrest for Driving Under Suspension.

(January 5: Thursday)

Officers responded to the area of the Sea Cabins in reference to a complaint of a suspicious person. Upon arrival, Officers located the subject and identified him as a subject that had been evicted from the Sea Cabins; however, had returned in an attempt to retrieve some of his belongings. Further, information was obtained from the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) database that the subject had outstanding warrants from the Mount Pleasant Police Department (MPPD) and the Greenwood County Sheriff's Office. The subject advised on scene Officers that he recently experienced heart surgery and was not feeling well. First Responders from the Isle of Palms Fire Department (IOPFD) were dispatched to the scene. The subject was, subsequently, transported to Roper Hospital and turned over to the MPPD.

(January 6: Friday)

An Officer was dispatched to the Ocean Club Villas, on Ocean Boulevard, in reference to a larceny. The victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen some of her children's toys from the front, common vestibule area of the first floor units.

(January 7: Saturday)

An Officer conducting route patrol of the Breach Inlet area observed a vehicle that appeared to be traveling at a higher rate of speed than the posted 35 mph. The Officer confirmed the speeding violation via in-car radar. A check of the operator's information through the SCDMV conceived that the driver's license was suspended. The subject was charged accordingly.

(January 9: Monday)

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her unlocked vehicle and stole a sunglass case from the glove compartment. At the time of the incident, her vehicle was parked in the driveway of her 25th Avenue residence.

(January 10: Tuesday)

A potential, out of state, vacation renter reported that she had conducted a search of the internet for condominiums for rent on the Isle of Palms. The victim stated that she visited the website for vacationrentals.com, through which she made reservations. Shortly after making the reservations online, the victim was contacted by a male subject claiming to be a realtor with vacationrentals.com, advising her that she would be required to pay rental fees at the time of the telephone call. The victim, in turn, wired the funds as directed. Subsequently, the victim received an email from the legitimate vacationrentals.com advising her that she may have been the victim of a fraudulent advertisement. The investigation continues.

(January 11: Wednesday)

An Officer in the area of Palm Boulevard and the Isle of Palms Connector (SC517) observed the license plate of the vehicle traveling in front of them to be expired. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was determined that the operator of the vehicle had a suspended driver's license. The female subject was placed under arrest for Driving Under Suspension, 2nd Offense and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

An Officer met with a victim at the Isle of Palms Public Safety Building in reference to a theft. The victim enounced that he stores his golf cart in the unenclosed portion of his Wild Dunes vacation home, and noticed that the golf cart was inoperable during his visit in December. During the same visit, the victim made arrangements with a local business to pick up his golf cart for repair with an early January pick-up date. On or about January 3, 2012, a representative with the business contacted the victim to inform him that the batteries had been stolen from the golf cart.

(January 12: Thursday)

While on route patrol of the Isle of Palms Connector, an Officer observed a vehicle which was traveling in front of him, having difficulty maintaining the designated lane of travel. A traffic stop was conducted, leading to the subsequent arrest of the operator for Driving Under the Influence.

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle after he observed the driver in violation of the seatbelt law. During interview of the operator, information was attained that both the license plate displayed on the vehicle and the operator's driver's license were suspended for failure to maintain insurance. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

(January 13: Friday)

While on route patrol of the Isle of Palms Connector, an Officer observed a vehicle versus vehicle collision. During investigation of the collision, it was determined that the operator of one of the vehicles driver's license was suspended. The operator was, subsequently, arrested and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center for booking.

(January 15: Sunday)

A victim reported that unknown person(s) vandalized his company vehicle by scratching the exterior of the driver side door. The vehicle was sitting in the driveway of his 26th Avenue residence during the time frame of the incident.

(January 16: Monday)

A victim reported that unknown person(s) vandalized her 31st Avenue residential mailbox by throwing a brick into it.

(January 17: Tuesday)

An Investigator met with a victim who had reported to the Public Safety building in reference to on-going acts of intimidation. The victim advised the Investigator that she and her husband are actively going through a divorce as a result of his infidelity. According to the victim, the female subject that her husband was allegedly having an affair with continuously sends her (the victim) unwanted text messages. Further, on the report date, the victim's juvenile son found a Valentine's Day decorated box with obscenities written on the top of the box. The box had been left in the front yard of their Waterway Boulevard residence. The Investigator contacted the suspect's attorney and assisted the victim in petitioning the court for a Restraining Order.

An Officer responded to Dunecrest Lane in reference to a Grand Larceny. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered onto her open rear deck and stole a bronze pelican statue.

An Officer conducting route patrol in the 700 block of Palm Boulevard observed a vehicle, traveling on Palm Boulevard, with a non-functioning headlamp. After conducting a lawful traffic stop, the operator of the vehicle was found in further violation for not having a driver's license. The same was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

(January 20: Friday)

An employee of the Kangaroo Express reported that unknown person(s) stole his bicycle, which he had parked in the rear of the business.

Officers responded to the Sea Cabins in reference to a Burglary. Upon arriving on scene, the Officers met with the owner who reported that two flat screened televisions had been stolen from within the unit. The victim further advised that the unit is a rental that is managed through Island Realty.

An Officer traveling inbound on the Isle of Palms Connector observed the vehicle traveling in front of her with a non-functioning brake lamp. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, the Officer obtained information from Telecommunications that the operator of the vehicle did not have a current driver's license. The operator was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.

(January 23: Monday)

An Officer responded to the Sea Cabins, on two separate occasions on the same date, in reference to two incidents of burglary. Electronics, specifically televisions were stolen. The cases were assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division. During the investigation, a lead and suspect developed. Additionally, it was discovered that a third, unoccupied rental unit at the Sea Cabins had been burglarized. Search warrants were obtained for the suspect's residence, incidentally, also at the Sea Cabins. During the execution of the search warrant, the rental agent advised Investigators that the television that was in the suspect's unit was missing and a second television had been damaged. Subsequently, arrest warrants were prepared.

(January 26: Thursday)

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for an equipment violation. While speaking with the driver, the Officer observed a female occupying the passenger seat, slumped over. The driver advised the Officer that he was driving the female subject to her 30th Avenue residence as a favor for a friend of his and does not know the female. The Officer attempted to wake the female, however, she did not respond. The Isle of Palms Fire Department First Responders was summoned to the scene. The female subject was, consequently, transported to the hospital by Charleston County EMS.

An Officer responded to Dunecrest Lane in reference to a grand larceny. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered onto her property and stole a blue heron lawn ornament.

(January 28: Saturday)

Officers were dispatched to the Kangaroo Express convenience store in reference to a shoplifting in progress. While en route, the clerk advised dispatch that the subject that had shoplifted several items had fled the business, on foot. Officers located the subject, as well as the stolen items, as described by the complainant. While speaking with the subject, it was determined that he was under the influence of alcohol. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Patrol

During the month of January, 2011, Officers issued 48 Business Check notices to business owners/employees advising them that the business was found unsecure. There were 27 Victim of Crime forms completed.

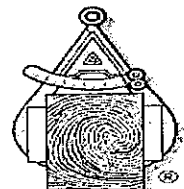
