The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of May, 2012.

(May 2: Wednesday)

Officers were dispatched to the beach access at Palm Boulevard and 21st Avenue in reference to an intoxicated subject that entered into his vehicle on the driver side, as if he were about to drive away from the scene. While speaking with the subject, the Officer detected a strong smell of alcoholic beverage about his person and it was obvious to the Officer that the subjects' faculties were appreciably impaired. During conversation, the subject advised that he was not going to drive and that he was waiting for his friend, who was going to drive them to their hotel in West Ashley. Shortly thereafter, another subject approached the vehicle, also intoxicated and admitted that he was the one that was going to drive the vehicle to West Ashley. Both were placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Facility for Disorderly Conduct.

(May 3: Thursday)

The victim reported that when she returned home from work, she observed a grease type substance smeared all over the interior walls of her 2nd Avenue residence. The victim advised responding Officers that she and her roommate has had a number of verbal altercations recently, and is the only person that has access to the residence. There were no indications of forced entry. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(May 4: Friday)

Officers were dispatched to a residence on 31st Avenue in reference to a burglary. Upon arrival, Officers met with the victims who reported that they had left the residence 7 days prior for vacation. When they returned home, they observed a number of items, predominantly jewelry missing. According to one of the victims, the housekeeper had been in the residence the day prior and did not notice anything out of place. The door leading into the residence from the garage was found to be unsecured. There were no indications of forced entry. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(May 5: Saturday)

An Officer was dispatched to a residence on 30th Avenue in reference to vandalism. The victim reported that unknown person(s) had "egged" the rear exterior walls of his residence.

(May 08: Tuesday)

An Officer conducted a traffic stop in reference to a seatbelt violation. A NCIC check showed the suspects SCDL as suspended. The suspect was transported to CC Jail.

Officers responded to a simple assault that occurred at Gate 1. The suspect left the area and was stopped in Ocean Park; after being identified by the victim, the suspect was placed under arrest and transported to CC Jail.

(May 09: Wednesday)

An unknown person(s) damaged the victim's mailbox.

The victim reported that a friend had become upset and had sent numerous threatening text messages. The victim relocated and, subsequently, did not wish to pursue charges.

A victim reported that an unknown person(s) stole two TVs from her unit at Ocean Club Villas while it was under renovation.

(May 11: Friday)

An Officer stopped a vehicle for an inoperative tail light. While interviewing the driver, he advised that there was marijuana in the vehicle. The suspect was placed under arrest and released on a PR citation.

(May 12: Saturday)

While conducting routine patrol in the 5700 block of Palm Boulevard, an Officer observed a subject walking along the roadway carrying an open container of Bud Light beer. The subject was charged accordingly.

(May 13: Sunday)

Officers responded to the report of a suspect throwing a propane tank through a window. The suspect was located and placed under arrest and charged with Malicious Injury to Property and Public Intoxication. The suspect was transported to the CCDC Center.

An Officer responded to East Cooper Hospital in regards to a victim with a gun shoot wound. The victim reported that while on Ocean Boulevard, earlier in the evening, two subjects attempted to rob him and when he refused to surrender his money, one subjects fired a round from a small handgun striking him in the knee.

The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a utility trailer from the backyard of the residence.

(May 15: Tuesday)

Officers were dispatched to the 1100 block of Ocean Boulevard in reference to suspicious circumstances. The caller advised that there were two subjects in the area smoking marijuana. Upon arrival in the area, Officers located the subjects. It was determined that the subjects were not smoking marijuana, however, were consuming alcoholic beverages in public. Both were charged accordingly.

The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her tax return checks, which she had placed on her night stand. Officers were advised that contractors had been in and out of her residence during the time frame of the theft.

An Officer conducted a traffic stop for speeding. While speaking with the driver, it was determined that the driver did not have a driver's license. The subject was charged accordingly.

(May 21: Monday)

An Officer stopped a vehicle and arrested the driver for an outstanding warrant.

(May 23: Wednesday)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a watch from his rental unit.

(May 24: Thursday)

An employee of a local business was arrested for stealing food items from the restaurant.

(May 25: Friday)

Fraud: A victim reported that unknown suspect/s copied and used a check from his checking account in Benton, Illinois.
