The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of April 2015.

Wednesday, April 1st

Impersonation – 5800 Palmetto Drive

Officers received two separate reports from victims who had been contacted by a subject claiming to be the night manager and that the establishment's computer had crashed causing their credit card information to be lost. Both victims provided the subject with their credit card information and upon checking their bank statements realized that unauthorized charges have been made. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, April 5th

Simple Possession Marijuana – Waterway Boulevard / Tabby Lane

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a speeding vehicle and upon contact with the driver, detected the odor of marijuana coming from within the vehicle. When asked, the driver relinquished a quantity of marijuana, which had been concealed on his person, to the Officer. The driver was charged and released.

Monday, April 6th

Simple Assault – 3000 Block Waterway Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a subject damaging a vehicle. Further investigation revealed that a physical assault had occurred between family members and it was determined who was the primary aggressor in the situation. A male subject was taken into custody and lodged at the Charleston County Juvenile Detention Center.

Tuesday, April 7th

Motor Vehicle Theft – JC Long Boulevard

The victim reported that an unknown person(s) had stolen her vehicle that had been legally parked in the parking lot. The vehicle was located abandoned on I-26 by Charleston County Sheriff's Office. The vehicle was towed and the owner contacted.

Friday, April 10th

Petit Larceny – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

The victim reported that unknown person(s) had removed the hand truck from his delivery vehicle while it was parked at a local store. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, April 11th

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Pavilion Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his vehicle, which was left unlocked, and stole his cellular phone and charger, which he valued at \$100. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, April 13th

Collision – Hit / Run Property Damage – Palmetto Drive / Pelican Reach

Officer responded to a report of a hit and run collision where a vehicle had struck a palmetto tree and then drove away. While the Officer was speaking with the complainant, a call was received regarding a subject wanting to report his vehicle stolen. Further investigation revealed that the subject wanting to report his vehicle stolen had been the driver involved in the hit and run collision. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to Charleston County Detention Center.

Wednesday, April 15th

Collision – Hit / Run Property Damage – Ocean Boulevard / JC Long Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a possible DUI driver and upon arrival located the area where the vehicle had run over two city benches and a street sign. A witness was able to provide a description of the vehicle and Officers located the vehicle's license plate, which had fallen off the vehicle. Officers were able to locate the driver and obtain a written statement. An arrest warrant was obtained and the driver was arrested, transported and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, April 18th

Driving Under the Influence – 20th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer conducted a traffic stop for a moving violation and upon contacting the driver determined that the driver was possibly under the influence of alcohol. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of the test placed the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing where the subject refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Burglary – 4000 Block Cameron Boulevard

The victim reported that she and several of her friends were staying at a rental home and had gone out for the evening. The next morning they discovered that unknown person(s) had stolen cash, jewelry and other items. The total of value of the items stolen is \$16,590. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, April 19th

Underage Possession of Alcohol – 55th Avenue

Officers responded to a residence for a noise complaint. Investigation revealed that there was loud music and talking on the porch and around the swimming pool. The subjects at the house were determined to be under the age of 21 and Officers observed them with open containers of beer. Officers charged nine subjects with minor in possession of beer and the noise violation.

Warrant Arrest – IOP Connector

An Officer responded to a report of a reckless driver. The Officer located the vehicle and upon making contact with the occupants, determined that the passenger had an active warrant with North Charleston Police Department for petit larceny. The passenger was arrested and transferred to North Charleston Police Department.

Wednesday, April 22nd

Driving Under the Influence – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer conducted a traffic stop for a speeding vehicle and upon contacting the driver, believed that he was possibly under the influence. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of the test, placed the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where the driver provided a breath sample that registered a .18% BAC. During the pre-tow inventory, Officers located a quantity of marijuana. The driver was transported and lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

False Pretense / Swindle – 300 Block Charleston Boulevard

A victim reported that she had responded to a Craigslist advertisement to rent a residence on the Isle of Palms and paid approximately \$2400 via PayPal. When she arrived at the residence, she contacted the property manager, who explained they do not rent through Craigslist. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, April 23rd

Weapon Law Violation – IOP Connector

An Officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a vehicle that was suspected to be operating under the influence and traveling at a high rate of speed, but the vehicle would not stop. The Officer pursued the vehicle onto I-526 and at Long Point Road discontinued the pursuit. It was later reported that the same vehicle would not stop for North Charleston Police Department and was involved in a collision near Trident Hospital. The driver was not apprehended, but a passenger was taken in for questioning. It was determined through the video from the Front Beach area that the vehicle had been on the island. It was also discovered that the driver had thrown out a handgun on the IOP Connector, which was recovered. Warrants for unlawful possession of a handgun and failure to stop for blue lights have been secured and entered into NCIC.

Saturday, April 25th

Criminal Domestic Violence – Morgan Place Drive

Officers responded to a report of a physical domestic situation. Further investigation revealed that both subjects were intoxicated and began arguing, which turned to a physical altercation. Officers identified both subjects as the primary aggressor and placed both under arrest, transported and lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Sunday, April 26th

Simple Assault – 32nd Avenue

The victim reported to Officers that he had been physically assaulted by his son. Officers responded and located the subject, who had pushed the victim to the floor, kicking and hitting him multiple times. The subject was placed under arrest, transported and lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Vandalism – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

The victim reported that an unknown person had removed a mug from the shelf and had relocated it to another shelf after urinating in it. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, April 29th

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 13th Avenue

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for moving violations and upon making contact with the driver, believed that he was possibly under the influence of alcohol. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at their conclusion, placed the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he provided a breath sample of .04% BAC. Due to the driver being under 21 years old, he was charged with Zero Tolerance and released to his parents.

Community Service / Personnel Recognition

During the month of April 2015, Officers issued seven (7) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices and one hundred twenty-six (126) Property Security Check notices.

Car Seat Installation / Inspection

On April 13, Officer Couche assisted with the proper installation of a child safety seat.

On April 30, Sergeant Baldrick assisted with the proper installation of a child safety seat.

Kids & Cops Program

On April 15, Officer Hardy reported to the IOP Recreation Department and met with the children in the classrooms. They discussed summer safety around water and bicycles. Officer Hardy read a book to the kids, answered questions, and listened to stories they had to share.

On April 22, Officer King reported to the IOP Recreation Department and met with two groups of children and their teachers. During his visit, he discussed issues such as duties of police officers, staying away from strangers, along with a wide variety of other things.

Employee Recognition

An island resident called to express how grateful she was for Ptl. Dylan Reynolds assistance in locating her family's dog that had gotten loose. Ptl. Reynolds located the family's dog at Breach Inlet after 9pm. The resident believes that had it not been for Ptl. Reynolds, they would not have been able to find their pet.

A resident mailed a card to the department to thank Communications Specialist Melissa Dawson and Pfc. Chad King for their assistance with a situation with a neighbor. She indicated that both employees were professional and had a calming nature that helped her to remain calm during the situation.
