The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of June 2015.

Monday, June 1st

Simple Possession of Marijuana – 14th Avenue

An Officer conducted a traffic stop for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had an arrest warrant with Summerville Police Department and was in possession of a quantity of marijuana. The driver was arrested and transferred to the Summerville Police Department.

Tuesday, June 2nd

Underage Possession – Ocean Point

An Officer responded to a noise complaint at the swimming pool area. The Officer located six (6) teenagers yelling and observed several bottles of beer and liquor around the pool deck. One of the teenagers ran from the Officer, but was apprehended. All subjects were arrested and charged.

Wednesday, June 3rd

Resisting Arrest – 3000 Block of Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a possible burglary in progress and upon arrival, located two subjects who had unlawfully entered into a residence under construction and were intoxicated. Investigation revealed that one was a juvenile, under the age of 17 and the other was a minor, under the age of 21. As both subjects were being arrested, the minor fled from the Officers towards the beach and into the ocean. Concerned for the subject's safety due to their intoxicated state, an Officer went in after the subject, taking her into custody. She was arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Thursday, June 4th

Petit Larceny – 1000 Block of Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) broke the lock on the swimming pool pump house and stole the pool motor, causing damage to the bolt lock and latch on the door. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Simple Assault – 41st Avenue

A victim reported that a subject that he has known for several years walked up and began to argue with him. The victim attempted to disengage from the argument by getting into his truck, but the subject continued antagonizing him. The victim exited his vehicle, at which point the subject struck him in the face and they both went to the ground and continued fighting. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, June 6th

Petit Larceny – Seascape Beach Access

A victim reported that while at the beach they left their beach chairs and bags unattended. During that time, an unknown person(s) stole their beach bag, which contained clothing, car keys, money, and mobile phones. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, June 7th

Drug Equipment Violations – Palm Boulevard / 14th Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation and contact with the occupants of the vehicle that there was an active NCIC entry for a missing person on one of the occupants. Further investigation revealed that the subject had a crack pipe hidden in the front of her pants and she was placed under arrest. Inside the vehicle, the Officer located a Styrofoam cup containing alcohol, which the subject under arrest claimed. The subject was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Public Intoxication – 1200 Block of Palm Boulevard

An Officer responded to a report of a subject refusing to pay his cab fare. The subject was instructed to get money from the ATM so he could pay his \$60.00 fare. After several minutes, the Officer went into the convenience store to check on the subject and found him passed out standing in front of the ATM. The subject was arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Driving Under Suspension – 1100 Block of Pavilion Drive

An Officer responded to a report of a moped that was driving recklessly. The Officer located the moped and observed the driver having difficulty navigating a turn, drive onto the shoulder of the road and then make an illegal U-turn. The Officer stopped the moped and further investigation revealed that the driver had been drinking alcohol and his driver's license was suspended. The driver was arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Monday, June 8th

Petit Larceny – Beach near 10th Avenue Beach Access

A victim reported that she had left her belongings on the beach unattended while she and her friends went for a walk. Upon their return, they found that unknown person(s) had stolen their purse, mobile phone and other personal belongings valued over \$550.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Burglary – 55th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her residence and stole nine (9) nineteen (19) inch flat screen televisions, valued at approximately \$1170. The victim will be providing the serial numbers for the televisions. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, June 10th

Aggravated Assault – 5800 Block of Palmetto Drive

Officers responded to a report of a kidnapping / abduction in progress. While responding, Officers were advised that the subject was in possession of a gun and had pointed it at the victim several times. Officers arrived on scene and engaged the subject, instructing him to drop the gun and get on the ground, to which he complied. The subject was arrested and charged with Burglary 1st Degree, Attempted Murder, Kidnapping, Possession of a Firearm during Commission of a Violent Crime, and Possession of Cocaine. The subject was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Drug Equipment Violation / Destruction of Property – 1100 Block of Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a local restaurant for a report of a subject possibly using narcotics in the restroom. It was reported that a subject ordered a glass of water, got a spoon and then went into the restroom. Officers knocked on the door to check on the subject and kept hearing a utensil drop onto the floor. The subject refused to open the door, but Officers were able to open the door where they observed the subject holding a syringe, they also located a syringe with an exposed needle on the restroom floor and in the trashcan located the spoon with burn marks on the bottom. The subject was charged and taken to a local hospital for evaluation.

Thursday, June 11th

Burglary – 800 Block of JC Long Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered the building and stole a quantity of copper wiring valued at approximately \$2000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, June 13th

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 13th Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contacting the driver of the vehicle, it was determined that she was possibly under the influence. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, subsequently placing the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where she provided a breath sample that registered a BAC of .13%. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Petit Larceny – 5700 Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) cut his bicycle lock and stole his two bicycles valued at approximately \$1030. The victim provided the serial numbers for the bicycles and they were entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, June 14th

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle matching the description of a vehicle that had just been involved in a hit and run collision on Sullivan's Island. Upon contacting the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, subsequently placing the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Petit Larceny – 5700 Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her bicycle and helmet, which had been left unsecured in the garage area of the resort. The value of the stolen items is approximately \$575. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, June 16th

Driving Under the Influence – 14th Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence of alcohol. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Test, subsequently placing the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he provided a breath sample that registered a BAC of .14%. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Friday, June 19th

Embezzlement – 300 Block of Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that a former employee had stolen approximately \$130,000 from various accounts held by the entity. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, June 20th

Petit Larceny – 24th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen and destroyed several items from the preschool area. The amount of items stolen is valued at approximately \$640 and the amount estimated destroyed is \$3,070. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny – 24th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into the church area and stole multiple items. There were items that were also vandalized. The approximate value of items stolen is \$1,450. The estimated value of the items damaged is \$800. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, June 22nd

Vandalism – Intracoastal Court

A victim reported that unknown person(s) come on her back porch and damaged the backs of the chairs on her patio. The value of the damaged property is estimated at \$600. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, June 24th

Vandalism – 1100 Block of Pavilion Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stuck one of the pillars of the gazebo, causing it to be structurally unsound. The estimated damage is \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, June 27th

Public Intoxication – IOP Connector

Officers responded to a report of a collision at the base of the IOP Connector near the traffic light. Upon arrival, Officers found the operator of a moped lying near the curb. Further investigation revealed that the subject smelled of alcohol and had struck the center median, causing him to strike the curb, go air borne, landing on his face. The subject was charged and released to Charleston County EMS to be transported to local hospital for treatment.

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for littering. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, subsequently placing the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Sunday, June 28th

Warrant Arrest – IOP Connector

An Officer on patrol observed a subject sitting on the railing of the IOP Connector and upon making contact, it was determined that he had an outstanding warrant for a traffic offense with Goose Creek Police Department. The warrant was confirmed; the subject was arrested and was transferred.

Petit Larceny – 4700 Block of Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole several flags from the building, to include an American flag, SC State flag, and a Red & White Citadel flag. The estimated value of the items stolen is \$138. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Community Service / Personnel Recognition

During the month of June 2015, Officers issued three (3) “You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime” notices and fifty-one (51) Property Security Check notices.

Officers were assigned to conduct enforcement on the beach in an effort to address citizen concerns of littering, alcohol on the beach and glass on the beach. As a result, one hundred forty-two (142) citations were issued for alcohol on the beach.

Car Seat Installation / Inspection

During the month of June 2015, Officer James Couche assisted citizens with the proper installation of child safety seats on one (1) occasion. Officer Amanda Postell assisted citizens with the proper installation of child safety seats on one (1) occasion.

Employee Recognition

The Department recognized Sergeant Matthew Maloney, Pfc. Kurt Zimmerman, and Pfc. Amanda Postell for their efforts in responding to a call for abduction / kidnapping at gunpoint in Wild Dunes. All officers reacted well and quickly took the suspect into custody without injury to anyone.

The Department recognized Detective Sergeant Swain and Detective Tarr for their efforts in developing leads for the multiple impersonation / credit card fraud cases that took place in Wild Dunes. Their efforts have resulted in these cases being transferred to the US Secret Service.

Isle of Palms Police Department

During the month of June 2015, the Consolidated Dispatch Center received and dispatched 5574 calls for service to the four (4) public safety agencies of Isle of Palms and Sullivan's Island, and the National Park Service. The following is a breakdown of activity by department.
