The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of May 2015.

Friday, May 1st

Credit Card Fraud – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that an unknown person(s) fraudulently used her credit / debit card after eating at a local restaurant. The charges that were made to the card were for out of state purchases for \$102.54. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, May 2nd

Assault & Battery - 4600 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that while she was working, an unknown male subject approached her and made sexual advances towards her, as well as placing his hands on her back and buttocks. She told the subject to leave her alone and that his comments and touching her were unwanted. Officers were able to locate the subject and he was placed under arrest for assault and battery 3rd degree. The subject was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Palm Boulevard / 21st Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her locked vehicle by breaking the front passenger side window. The subjects then stole her wallet containing various credit cards and other items. Further investigation revealed that the subjects had used one of the credit cards at a local convenience store on the island. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, May 3rd

Credit Card Fraud – 5800 Block Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that an unknown person called him, impersonating a hotel employee, stating that there was an issue with the system and he needed to provide his credit card information again. The unknown subject attempted to make a charge to the credit card of \$1.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Burglary – Grand Pavilion Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his residence and removed several televisions and other household items valued at \$1,225.00. No serial numbers for the stolen items were provided. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, May 7th

Grand Larceny – Morgan Place Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole several items of jewelry from her residence. The stolen items are valued at approximately \$3,460.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, May 8th

Driving Under the Influence – 2200 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer responded to a collision involving two vehicles. Investigation revealed that the driver of one of the vehicles involved was possibly under the influence. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, placed the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where the driver provided a breath sample of .00%. Based on this result, an Officer certified as a Drug Recognition Expert was requested and it was determined that the driver was under the influence a narcotic analgesic. The driver was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – 29th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for speeding and upon contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, placed the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, May 9th

Criminal Domestic Violence – 4000 Block Hartnett Boulevard

Officers responded to a physical domestic dispute and determined that the male subject was the primary aggressor. During the altercation, he physically assaulted the female subject and then began to throw furniture and other items around the residence. The male subject was placed under arrest and lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – JC Long Boulevard / Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation and upon contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, placed the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he provided a breath sample registering .16%. The driver was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Tuesday, May 12th

Petit Larceny – Palm Boulevard / 26th Avenue

A victim reported that an unknown person(s) stole her surfboard that was left near the roadside as she was retrieving her vehicle. The value of the surfboard is approximately \$400.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, May 16th

Petit Larceny – 700 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a bicycle, which had been left outside next to the garage. The victim was unable to provide a serial number and the approximate value of the stolen property is \$400.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, May 17th

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 14th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into their parked vehicle and stolen a cell phone, identification cards, and jewelry. The stolen items are valued at approximately \$2,267.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, May 18th

Assault – 100 Block Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a local restaurant in reference to an intoxicated subject who had struck IOP Fire Personnel in the face while being treated. The subject was combative and belligerent and after being arrested for the assault, then kicked on of the Officers in the leg, refused to sit in the back seat of the Police cruiser, then spit at the Officers. The subject was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Grand Larceny – 100 Block Charleston Boulevard

A victim reported that an unknown person(s) stole her jewelry from her residence. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$8,700.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, May 19th

Criminal Domestic Violence – 2100 Block Waterway Boulevard

A male subject reported to the IOPPSB to report a domestic violence situation. After the Officer obtained initial information, he responded to the residence where the incident took place. Further investigation revealed that there had been an argument between the male and female, which then escalated to a physical altercation. It was determined that the male subject was the primary aggressor and was placed under arrest, then transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Friday, May 22nd

Driving Under the Influence – 14th Avenue / Ocean Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized

Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, placed the driver under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing and provided a breath sample registering .19%. The driver was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Monday, May 25th

Burglary – 200 Block Charleston Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole the rear tire from her bicycle and a bottle of liquor, which were located inside the garage that had been left unlocked. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$75.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny – 11—Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that several young black juveniles who were selling palm flowers on the beach approached her and while speaking with them, one stole her iPhone from inside her purse. A description of the juveniles was broadcast and an Officer located them. The iPhone was recovered and the responsible juvenile was arrested and released to his parents.

Weapon Law Violation – 14th Avenue

Officers received a report of a victim who had been shot in the leg by an unknown person(s) from the IOP Fire Department via radio transmission. Initially, the victim was unable to provide a description of the subject who had fired the gun. The victim was transported and further investigation by CID led to the victim admitting that he had accidentally shot himself. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Drug/Narcotics Violation – 14th Avenue / Ocean Boulevard

An Officer conducting foot patrol observed a vehicle pass by and yell profanities and derogatory statements about the Police while there were many citizens in the area. The Officer stopped the vehicle, smelled a strong odor of alcohol, and observed an open container. The driver and passenger were arrested and further investigation revealed a large quantity of marijuana inside the vehicle. The subjects were lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Wednesday, May 27th

Underage Possession of Alcohol – Seahorse Court

Officers responded to a complaint of multiple parking violations. Upon their arrival, they found several illegally parked vehicles, could hear loud voices and music coming from the back of one of the homes. As they approached the house, Officers had subjects running towards them. The subjects were stopped and further investigation revealed that there was an underage drinking party taking place. Officers arrested seven subjects, who were released to a parent.

Petit Larceny – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that an unknown person(s) stole his bicycle that had been left in the bicycle rack, unsecured. The bicycle is valued at approximately \$200.00. The victim was able to give a very detailed description of the bicycle, but no serial number. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, May 28th

Grand Larceny – 3100 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into the residence and stole her wallet and jewelry. The value of the items taken is approximately \$4,250.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, May 29th

Credit Card Fraud – 5800 Block Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that a male subject who claimed to be an employee of the resort contacted her. The subject explained that there was an issue and he needed to obtain the victim's credit card number again. The victim provided the information and she was later advised of fraudulent activity. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, May 31st

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 14th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his vehicle, which had been left unsecured, and removed his wife's purse containing several debit / credit cards, currency, and personal identification. The approximate value of the items taken was \$50.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Officers were assigned to conduct enforcement on the beach in an effort to address citizen concerns of littering and alcohol on the beach. As a result, sixty-nine (69) city citations were issued for alcohol on the beach.

Community Service / Personnel Recognition

During the month of May 2015, Officers issued five (5) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices and eighty-five (85) Property Security Check notices.

Car Seat Installation / Inspection

During the month of May 2015, Officer Amanda Postell assisted with proper installation of a child safety seat with three (3) citizens and Officer Dylan Reynolds assisted two (2) citizens.

Kids & Cops Program

On May 6, Officer Crockett reported to the IOP Recreation Department and met with the kids in the classrooms. She read a book, titled "A Day with Police Officers" and then discussed various topics related to safety, police equipment, and their families.

Employee Recognition

A citizen visiting the island called to express her appreciation for Sergeant Sharon Baldrick and Ptl. James Taylor who assisted her when her keys were locked inside her car. She explained that they stayed with her until AAA arrived, making her feel safe. The officers charged her phone with their car charger.

A citizen visiting the island called to thank Ptl. James Couche and Ptl. Louise Hardy for their professionalism and assistance at the IOP Marina when they were having difficulty backing the boat trailer down the ramp.
