The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of March 2009.

Patrol

March 2, 2009 Officers responded to a residence on Palm Boulevard where a citizen reported an occupied vehicle backed into a driveway. While responding, the vehicle was reported to be heading southbound on Palm Boulevard. An officer observed the vehicle and followed it for a short period of time before stopping it on the 100 block of Palm Boulevard. While speaking to the subjects in the vehicle, a quantity of marijuana was observed in the doorframe of the passenger seat. A pre-tow inventory resulted in a bag being found containing marijuana and assorted drug paraphernalia, as well as open containers of beer. All three occupants were charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana and two with Minor in Possession of Beer.

March 4, 2009 At the request of Sullivan's Island Police, officers responded to Atlantic Avenue to a Criminal Domestic Violence call that was still ongoing. Our officers assisted in the arrest of both participants and located a quantity of marijuana on the male subject involved. Once the incident was defused and both parties were in custody our officers returned to the Isle of Palms.

March 5, 2009 Just after 2 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a male subject leaning against a vehicle in the middle of Charleston Boulevard urinating on the roadside. The officer stopped to investigate and determined that the subject was intoxicated, and was taken into custody charged with Disorderly Conduct.

March 6, 2009 Just after 10 P.M., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Ocean Boulevard for an equipment violation and while checking the drivers information

determined that he was wanted by the Mount Pleasant Police Department for an outstanding Bench Warrant for Defrauding an Innkeeper. A Mount Pleasant officer responded to their location to assume custody of the driver, where he was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

March 9, 2009 After stopping a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation the officer determined that the driver had been operating her vehicle without insurance since 2007. While taking the driver into custody her husband who was a passenger in the vehicle interfered in the incident to a point where he had to be charged with Hindering.

March 11, 2009 Just after midnight an officer on patrol observed a vehicle traveling on Palm Boulevard without operative headlights then execute a U-Turn and park in a front yard on the 2800 block of Palm Boulevard. The officer stopped to investigate and while speaking to the driver immediately noted a strong odor of alcohol emitting from within the vehicle, as well as the driver having slurred speech, bloodshot, and glassy eyes. The officer administered several Field Sobriety Tests, which the driver failed. He was then taken into custody and transported to headquarters for a Datamaster Test, which registered a .15% level of alcohol. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

March 12, 2009 At the request for assistance from the Sullivan's Island Police Department, Isle of Palms officers responded to Bayonne Street to assist with a large underage party involving alcohol.

March 12, 2009 Officers responded to a front beach condominium unit where a female had contacted the front desk for help after being assaulted by her common-law husband in their rental unit. Officers met with the victim in the lobby then went to the room to place investigate further. The officers determined the husband to be the primary aggressor and placed him under arrest, while taking him into custody he resisted arrest and fought the officers resulting in an officer needing to use his baton to effect the arrest. While on the way to the Detention Center, the suspect kicked a rear door panel causing damage to the door and with his teeth tore a hole in the vinyl headrest of the rear seat. Due to his actions members of the Tactical Team met him at the door of the Detention Center and assumed custody. The suspect was charged with Criminal Domestic Violence, Resisting Arrest, and Malicious Damage to Public Property.

March 14, 2009 Just after 1:30 A.M., an officer on patrol on the Connector stopped a vehicle that had been weaving in and out of the lane of travel and onto the median reflectors. Once the vehicle was stopped the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. The driver admitted that she had been drinking alcohol at a local nightspot. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which she failed, and was transported to headquarters for a Datamaster Test, where she registered a .13% level of alcohol. She was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

March 15, 2009 Officers responded to the 200 block of Forest Trail, where a road rage incident had been reported. The victim alleges that a vehicle stopped in front of him in the street and the driver got out of his vehicle and started a verbal altercation, which ended with him being assaulted. Due to differing accounts from each party involved, the alleged victim was advised how to pursue charges if he wished. The incident appeared to be over a vehicle following the other too closely.

March 15, 2009 Just after 1:30 A.M., officers on foot patrol observed a male subject seated on the steps of a front beach business yelling profanities to persons walking by. After warning the subject he again began to yell and shout profanities, and was taken into custody charged with Public Disorderly Conduct.

March 15, 2009 Officers responded to JC Long Boulevard and Pavilion Drive where a dispute in the roadway had been reported. The responding officers discovered the dispute was over a two- car accident that had just occurred. While investigating the accident the officer determined that one driver was impaired, due to her slurred speech and strong odor of alcohol emitting from her person. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which she failed, and was taken into custody where she later refused to provide a breath sample for the Datamaster Test. She was charged with DUI, No Insurance, and was transported to the Detention Center.

March 16, 2009 A former employee of the Isle of Palms Post Office was charged with one count of Petit Larceny for a January 2009 investigation where the subject admitted to stealing two Wal-Mart gift cards from the mail then cashing them in for merchandise. The subject turned himself in to Investigators voluntarily.

March 18, 2009 Just before 10 P.M., a resident reported that there was a vehicle on the beach near 39th Avenue doing donuts in the sand. Officers responded, located, and stopped the vehicle, which was occupied by two sixteen year-old male subjects. An officer observed a bottle of whiskey in the rear seat and both subjects were directed to exit the vehicle. The driver was found to be in possession of a quantity of loose controlled substance pills and was taken into custody. The passenger was not charged with anything and was released to the custody of his parent. The driver was charged with Purchase/Possession/Consumption of Liquor by a Minor, Possession of Schedule II Controlled Substance, Possession of Schedule III Controlled Substance, and No Vehicles on Beach/Beach Access. The juvenile driver was later released to the custody of his grandfather with the Drug and Alcohol charges being set for Family Court.

March 19, 2009 An officer responded to a Lagoon Road residence where a vandalism had been reported. It was determined that a dispute had taken place resulting in a male subject using a golf club to break items in the home. A computer check of the parties involved indicated that the complainant was wanted by the North Charleston Police Department for an outstanding Bench Warrant. He was taken into custody and released to a North Charleston police officer. The complainant did not want to press charges for the vandalism.

March 19, 2009 Officers responded to a Cameron Boulevard residence where a domestic dispute had been reported. The matter was determined to be a verbal argument between boyfriend and girlfriend. The officers quelled the situation and had both parties agree to discontinue their dispute.

March 21, 2009 Just before 1 A.M., officers responded to a residence on Waterway Boulevard where a domestic disturbance had been reported. Upon the officer's arrival, they were met by a female subject who stated that she had a tooth knocked out by her boyfriend, who stated that he wanted to kill her. The male subject was immediately located and taken into custody. Due to the fact that the two persons involved were mutual combatants both were charged with Simple Assault, and transported to the Detention Center.

March 22, 2009 Just before 3 A.M., an officer conducting stationary traffic enforcement near Breach Inlet stopped a vehicle for speeding as it turned onto Charleston Boulevard. While speaking to the driver, the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. The driver was administered several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed and was transported to headquarters for a Datamaster Test, where he registered a .05% level of alcohol. Based on the fact that the driver was a teenager and underage to lawfully consume alcohol he was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

March 24, 2009 Officers responded to a 911 hang-up at a Palm Boulevard residence, and upon their arrival were met at the door by an intoxicated female subject, who had reportedly been arguing with her intoxicated common law husband. While separating the female subject from her partner, she turned around and assaulted an officer present in the shoulder and face. She was immediately taken into custody for that offense, and since there was no indication that any assault had taken place between the subjects no other charges were made. The female subject was charged with Simple Assault and transported to the Detention Center.

March 27, 2009 At approximately 1:30 A.M., an officer on patrol ran a computer check of a license plate, which did not match the vehicle that it was on. The officer stopped the vehicle to investigate and determined that the driver had no driver's license or vehicle documentation. A computer check of the driver indicated that his license was suspended. The driver was taken into custody charged with DUS 2nd offense, Operating Uninsured, and Lend/Borrow Steal License Plate, and transported to the Detention Center.

March 27, 2009 A Sullivan's Island police officer requested the assistance of a Datamaster certified officer to conduct an alcohol test on a female subject they had in custody suspected of DUI. The subject was brought to the Isle of Palms Police Department and administered the Datamaster test, where she refused to provide a sample. She was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

March 28, 2009 A theft of empty beer kegs from a restaurant was reported by a citizen who observed the theft occur while in the parking lot near Breach Inlet. A suspect was developed and the case has been assigned to an Investigator for follow-up. There has been a rash of beer keg thefts from restaurants and bars in the Mount Pleasant area.

March 29, 2009 An officer on patrol on the Connector stopped a vehicle that was excessively speeding in the rain. When the officer approached the driver he immediately detected an odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed, and was transported to headquarters for a Datamaster Test. The teenage driver refused to provide a sample and due to his age was charged with Zero Tolerance and Speeding. He was later released to the custody of his mother.

March 29, 2009 Just before 8 A.M., a citizen reported finding an apparent deceased male subject in the men's restroom near the front beach. A patrol officer responded and confirmed that a male subject had apparently committed suicide in a stall of the restroom. Isle of Palms Investigators and the County Coroner responded to investigate, process the scene and make appropriate notifications.

March 30, 2009 Just after 11 P.M., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard at 21st Avenue for an equipment violation. While the officer spoke to the driver, he detected an odor of alcohol from inside of the vehicle and noted that the driver's speech was slow and slurred. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which she failed. The driver was transported to headquarters to be administered a Datamaster Test, where she refused to provide a sample. She was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

March 31, 2009 A Sullivan's Island police officer requested that one of our certified Datamaster Operators perform a Datamaster Test on a male subject that he suspected of driving under the influence. The subject was transported to the Isle of Palms Police Department and administered the test.

March 31, 2009 Officers responded to a residence on 28th Avenue where a fight in progress had been reported. Officers made contact with the parties involved, which were brothers. Neither subject wanted to pursue charges against each other. The older brother returned to his downtown apartment in order to calm the situation.

March 31, 2009 An officer stopped a vehicle for a license tag violation and while speaking to the driver discovered that his license was suspended. He was charged with DUS 1st, Failure to Surrender Suspended License Plate, and No Proof of Insurance.

Personnel/Community Relations

March 31, 2009 For the month of March, officers discovered six businesses and four homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of seventy- eight Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or property owners for various violations noted, or to advise them that an officer checked their business while on patrol.
