The following is a synopsis of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of March 2008.

Patrol

March 1, 2008 Officers responded to the beach near 29th Avenue where it was reported that a male juvenile had sustained a surfing injury. The officers determined that the subject had been badly cut by the blade of his surfboard through his wetsuit and was serious enough where he needed immediate medical attention, due to severe loss of blood. Fire Department personnel provided immediate medical aid and the subject was then transported to the Recreation Center where he was transported by a Meducare helicopter to MUSC.

March 2, 2008 Just after midnight, a possible drunk driver was reported to be traveling toward the Isle of Palms from Sullivan's Island. An officer located the vehicle and followed it documenting the driver's actions on videotape. The vehicle was stopped and when the officer approached he immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. The driver failed several Field Sobriety Tests that were administered and was transported to headquarters where the driver refused to submit to a Datamaster Test. The driver was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

March 2, 2008 Officers responded to a Palmetto Drive location where it was reported that a male subject had been stabbed. The officers observed the victim to have a deep stab wound to his abdomen. The victim claimed that the wound was accidental and was done while playing around with a knife while drinking alcohol with a female acquaintance. The female subject confirmed that the wound was accidental and occurred after a long evening of consuming alcohol.

March 3, 2008 Just after midnight, an officer on patrol observed a vehicle operating erratically and followed it onto the connector. After the vehicle was stopped the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. After failing several Field Sobriety Tests, the subject was transported to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test where he registered a .29% level of alcohol in his system. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

March 4, 2008 An Investigator responded to the East Cooper Hospital where a female at that location reported that she had been sexually assaulted. An Investigator met with the victim and took her to the MUSC Women's Health Clinic for a forensic examination. It was determined that the incident occurred at a residence on 21st Avenue. Investigators were able to identify the male suspect who fully cooperated with the police department. The investigation continues.

March 5, 2008 Officers responded to a Palm Boulevard residence regarding a reported domestic dispute. Officers separated the couple and determined that the situation had been a verbal argument over the telephone. The female subject was placed on Trespass Notice and advised accordingly.

March 5, 2008 At approximately 6 P.M., an officer responded to a front beach business where an intoxicated subject was reported sitting on the steps of a business. The officer determined that the female subject was extremely intoxicated and unable to provide any personal information or the location where she was staying. She was taken into custody and charged with Public Intoxication.

March 5, 2008 A female subject who was wanted by the Mount Pleasant Police Department came to our police headquarters to turn herself in to authorities for her outstanding charges. A Mount Pleasant officer arrived and assumed custody of the subject.

March 6, 2008 Just after 9 A.M., officers responded to a Grand Pavilion Boulevard residence where a possible domestic dispute had been reported by a family member. Officers were met at the door by the wife who stated that her husband had been drinking alcohol since the previous afternoon and was extremely intoxicated and out of control, but not physical with anyone in the house. No assault had taken place, but to control the subject, the couples grown son had restrained him with duct tape until police arrived. The officers went upstairs and took control of the subject who was loudly yelling profanities that could be heard outside by people walking by. The subject was charged with Breach of Peace and transported to the Detention Center.

March 6, 2008 Just after 10 P.M., an officer on patrol on the beach was advised that when he passed the area of 42nd Avenue, several juvenile subjects ran into the dunes to hide from the officer. The officer returned from a different direction and located subjects parked in a pickup truck at the 42nd Avenue Beach Access. When the officer approached the vehicle, beer bottles were discarded from within the vehicle. One subject

in the vehicle assumed responsibility and was charged with Minor in Possession of Alcohol, No Alcohol on the Beach or Streets and Possession of an Altered DL.

March 9, 2008 A Sullivan's Island Police Officer requested assistance regarding a possible break-in in progress on Central Avenue. A subject was arrested at the scene.

March 11, 2008 After stopping a vehicle for speeding on the Connector the officer observed the driver had slurred speech and bloodshot eyes. After conducting a series of Field Sobriety Tests, the driver was determined not to be under the influence of alcohol. A quantity of marijuana was located and the driver was charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana.

March 11, 2008 Just before midnight, an officer stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for speeding and crossing over the double yellow line several times. It was determined that the driver was nineteen years old and in possession of a quantity of beer and liquor. After failing several Field Sobriety Tests, the driver was taken into custody where he registered a .05% level of alcohol. Due to his age, he was charged with Zero Tolerance of Alcohol, Minor in Possession of Alcohol, and Possession of an Altered DL.

March 12, 2008 After an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. Both female subjects in the vehicle denied that they had been drinking alcohol. Due the fact that they were underage the officer investigated further and determined that both were in possession of Beer, Vodka, Rum, and Bourbon. Both were charged with Underage Possession of Liquor.

March 12, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island Police Officer, an officer assisted in the search of a residence on Middle Street that had been found unsecured.

March 13, 2008 Officers responded to a Palm Boulevard residence, where a maintenance man for the residence reported that when he walked into the residence to get some tools, he was jumped by a male subject punched in the face and thrown to the floor then forced to stay on the floor at gunpoint, where his cell phone, IPOD and \$300 in cash were stolen from his person. A second male subject appeared with a handgun and threatened him not to get up while the two suspects left in their vehicle. Police response was delayed because the victim first went to another location to tell a coworker who then called the homeowner before 911 was called. Due to the television and newspaper coverage of the incident, several anonymous tips have been received. The investigation continues.

March 13, 2008 Officers responded to Forest Trail where numerous residents in the area, many who also reported that a vehicle had been speeding, reported a vehicle collision. The responding officers discovered that the vehicle had failed to negotiate a turn in the road and struck a tree in the front yard of a residence. The badly injured driver was removed from the vehicle by Fire Department personnel and transported by EMS to MUSC for surgery. The driver was later cited for Reckless Driving and DUS.

March 16, 2008 An officer on patrol observed a vehicle on Palm Boulevard operating erratically and stopped it near 39th Avenue. When the officer approached the driver he immediately observed an open beer bottle in the center console cup holder. After failing several Field Sobriety Tests the driver was transported to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test where he registered a .17% level of alcohol. He was charged with DUI and Open Container and transported to the Detention Center.

March 17, 2008 Just before 1 A.M., officers responded to a residence on Back Bay Drive regarding a noise complaint. The officers clearly heard people talking loudly on the upstairs porch and went to the front door to investigate. The officers spoke to a male subject at the door and observed a large quantity of alcohol containers in plain view. The officers were allowed in and discovered that ten of the eleven persons present were underage to consume alcohol. A keg of beer was located in a bathtub in an upstairs bathroom. The keg was emptied and all remaining alcohol was photographed and destroyed. One subject over the age of twenty-one was charged with Transfer of Gift to a Minor and the remaining eleven subjects were charged with Underage Possession of Beer.

March 17, 2008 After stopping a vehicle for speeding on Palmetto Drive, the officer detected an odor of freshly burned marijuana emitting from within the vehicle. A quantity of marijuana was found in the driver's pocket and he was taken into custody charged with Speeding and Simple Possession of Marijuana.

March 17, 2008 An officer accompanied a Berkeley County Sheriff's Deputy to a residence on Cameron Boulevard to assist in serving a Family Court Arrest Warrant on a female subject at that location. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Berkeley County Jail.

March 20, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Cameron Boulevard regarding a request for medical assistance to a male subject. When entry was made to the house with Fire Department personnel the officers observed liquor and beer bottles all over the area, and everyone present appeared to be underage. Two of the nine persons present were over twenty-one and the rest were underage. The sick subject was treated and released on scene. Two subjects present were charged with Transfer of Beer/Wine to Person Under 21, and the remaining seven were charged with Underage Possession of Beer/Wine. A parent of one of the subjects and owner of the home was summoned from Mount Pleasant where she supervised cleanup and assumed responsibility for the subjects until the following day when they were asked to leave.

March 21, 2008 Officers responded to a front beach condominium unit where an employee discovered an unconscious female subject on the floor. Fire Department personnel also responded and revived the subject until she could be transported to the hospital by EMS. Evidence recovered at the scene indicated that the subject had tried unsuccessfully to commit suicide with an overdose of injected drugs.

March 22, 2008 The owner of a local liquor store reported that a male subject had attempted to purchase liquor with a false identification, then fled the store when he was questioned. The subject was located on Waterway Boulevard near 22nd Avenue then positively identified by the storeowner and charged with Falsification of Age to Purchase Liquor.

March 22, 2008 Officers responded to a JC Long Boulevard restaurant where management had reported an unruly and intoxicated subject who had refused to leave the premises. The subject was located and asked to leave the premises and became argumentative using loud profanities that could be heard by every customer present. The subject was escorted outside then refused to cooperate and resisted arrest to the point where physical force had to be used to handcuff the subject. He was charged with Disorderly Conduct and Resisting Arrest and transported to the Detention Center.

March 23, 2008 After stopping a vehicle for speeding on the Connector, the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol while speaking to the driver. After failing several Field Sobriety Tests he was transported to headquarters where he refused to provide a sample for the Datamaster Test. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

March 24, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Carolina Boulevard where noise had been reported. Officers observed empty beer bottles and cans on the ground and identified three subjects in the front yard as underage. Sixteen subjects were present with two being juveniles, who were separated from the adults. The two juveniles were charged in Family Court with Minor in Possession of Alcohol and released to the custody of their parents. Six subjects were charged with Minor in Possession of Alcohol, and seven subjects over the age of twenty-one were charged with Transfer of Beer to a Minor. All alcohol present was photographed and destroyed.

March 25, 2008 An officer responded to the East Cooper Hospital where it was reported that they were treating a male victim of a stabbing. The victim was very vague in providing information regarding the identity of the suspect and exactly where on the Isle of Palms the incident occurred. It was finally determined that a female subject was responsible and we had arrested her earlier in the evening for outstanding traffic charges. It was determined that the incident occurred in a residence between 35th and 40th Avenue. Investigators conducted a follow-up investigation and identified the suspect but could not prosecute the case because the victim failed to cooperate. This case has been closed.

March 26, 2008 At approximately 2 A.M., officers responded to 17th Avenue where a resident reported a suspicious vehicle driving in their backyard. The responding officer located the vehicle with a male driver passed out behind the wheel. When awakened, the driver failed several Field Sobriety Tests given and was transported to headquarters where he refused to provide a sample for the Datamaster Test. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

March 26, 2008 After stopping a speeding vehicle on Waterway Boulevard, the officer determined that the driver was wanted in Georgia by the Clay County Sheriff's Office. The driver was taken into custody for the Arrest Warrant, charged with Speeding and transported to the Detention Center.

March 27, 2008 A Department of Natural Resources Officer requested the assistance of an officer with three male subjects in custody for Minor in Possession of Alcohol at the Marina on 41st Avenue.

March 28, 2008 Officers responded to Grand Pavilion Boulevard where a male juvenile reported that several college age male subjects at the pool of the Inn had assaulted him. The officers were unable to locate or identify the subjects responsible.

March 29, 2008 Just before 2 A.M., an officer observed a female subject strike a male subject in the face on the front porch of a front beach establishment. The male subject did not wish to press charges, but the female was unable to care for her own self. The officer attempted to get the female to contact a friend to get her home safely and she proceeded to call 911 several times, stating that she was not going to call anyone. The subject was taken into custody charged with Disorderly Conduct and transported to the Detention Center. While on the way to the Detention center in Mount Pleasant, the subject began banging her head on the cage, then began kicking the side window. The officer stopped and when he was attempting to further restrain her, he was kicked in the chest. After several warnings to comply the officer deployed his OC Spray on the subject, where she then cooperated. Mount Pleasant Fire Department personnel responded to wash the spray away and she was then lodged in the Detention Center.

March 30, 2008 A vehicle was stopped on Palm Boulevard for speeding on the Connector, and while the officer was speaking to the driver he detected an strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. The seventeen year old denied that he had been drinking, but an open beer can was observed in the floorboard of the vehicle. After being taken into custody the driver was then found to be in possession of a quantity of marijuana in his pants pocket. After the subject was transported to headquarters he submitted to a Datamaster Test where he registered a .06% level of alcohol. Due to his age the subject was charged with Zero Tolerance of Alcohol, Minor in Possession of Alcohol, Open Container, and Simple Possession of Marijuana.

March 30, 2008 Officer's responded to a front beach condominium unit where loud noise had been reported. The officers observed a large quantity of beer and liquor present while speaking to the occupants and noted that the subjects present all appeared to be underage. Six female subjects present were charged with Minor in Possession of Alcohol. All alcohol was photographed then destroyed.

March 31, 2008 An officer observed a suspicious vehicle parked under a rental unit on Palm Boulevard and when a computer check of the license plate was run, it was determined that the vehicle had been stolen from Hertz Rental at the Charleston Airport. The residence was unoccupied and the vehicle was towed away. The Aviation Authority

Police had an Arrest Warrant on file for the person who had not returned the vehicle. The following day, Investigators followed up on the incident and were able to determine that the suspect in the stolen vehicle incident was now staying at another rental unit at Beach Side Villas. It was also determined that the same subject had paid a local rental company with two worthless checks totaling over \$17,000. The Investigators and patrol officers went to the suspect's rental unit on Palmetto Drive and placed him under arrest without incident. He was charged with 2 counts of Drawing and Uttering a Fraudulent Check as well as Grand Larceny of a Motor Vehicle for the Charleston Aviation Police Arrest Warrant.

Personnel/Community Relations

March 6, 2008 ACO V. Cook received a letter of appreciation from a citizen thanking her for her advice in handling an animal problem in their neighborhood.

March 11, 2008 Chief Buckhannon and Sgt. O'Donnell met with staff members of local rental agencies, where short- term rentals and noise complaints were discussed.

March 12, 2008 Bear Cub Scout Troop 59 sent a thank you note to Sgt. Caldwell, Sgt. Usry, Det. Tarr, PFC Baldrick and PFC Schwenk for their recent presentation their troop in conducting a training class for them.

March 11- 16, 2008 Chief Buckhannon, Sgt. Usry and Sgt. Caldwell traveled to Atlanta, Georgia to attend training provided by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. then participated in a hearing from CALEA Commissioners to determine if the Isle of Palms Police Department would be awarded their second Re-Accreditation. The hearing was successful and the police department was awarded Re-Accreditation status. The Mayor, two City Council Members, and the City Administrator attended the hearing and awards banquet.

March 24, 2008 Detective D. Tarr and ACO V. Cook participated in the annual Cops and Lobsters fundraiser sponsored by the local Fraternal Order of Police Lodge. They served meals to patrons at the Red Lobster Restaurant and all tips received were donated to the FOP earmarked for the Special Olympics.

March 27, 2008 PFC J. Schwenk was awarded Police Officer of the Year by the local Exchange Club, for his continued proactive enforcement of alcohol related crimes, which included thirty arrests for DUI in 2007.

March 31, 2008 For the month of March, officers on patrol discovered two businesses and one home with open or unsecured doors. A total of eighty-nine Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or property owners for various violations noted by officers on patrol.
