The following is a synopsis of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of May 2008.

## **Patrol**

May 2, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Tabby Lane where it was reported that a male subject had been shot. The officers immediately determined that the subject had accidentally shot himself in the buttocks and leg while removing a handgun from his back pocket. Fire Department first responders provided medical aid until the subject could be transported to the hospital for treatment. The incident was ruled an accidental discharge.

May 3, 2008 A concerned citizen approached a police officer at the Isle of Palms Marina to advise that he observed a male subject stumble down the steps from the restaurant then get into a vehicle occupied by juveniles. He then watched the subject drive away and thought that he may have been intoxicated. The vehicle was located and stopped on Waterway Boulevard and was occupied by the male suspect and four juveniles. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed. He was then transported to headquarters for a Datamaster Test. Another officer turned the juveniles over to their respective guardians. The subject submitted to the Datamaster Test and registered a .21% level of alcohol. He was charged with DUI and Child Endangerment and transported to the Detention Center.

May 4, 2008 After observing a vehicle speeding on Palm Boulevard near 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue, an officer stopped the vehicle. While speaking to the driver, the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle and noted the driver was slurring his speech. The driver admitted that he had been drinking at a local establishment, and submitted to

several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed and was taken into custody. After being offered the Datamaster Test, the driver refused to provide a sample, and was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

May 7, 2008 After stopping a vehicle on the Connector for an equipment violation, the officer made the determination that the driver was operating with a suspended license and had nine unpaid traffic tickets. He was taken into custody and charged with DUS and NRVC 9 counts. The passenger was also charged NRVC 2 counts for two unpaid tickets. Both were taken into custody and transported to the Detention Center.

May 9, 2008 An officer on foot patrol on Ocean Boulevard observed an intoxicated male subject walking on the sidewalk with a can of beer in his hand. When the officer asked him to stop, the subject threw the can of beer to the ground. The subject then began yelling obscenities and was arrested and placed in the rear of a police vehicle for transport. Before the police vehicle got two blocks away, the subject began banging his head on the cage. He was then further restrained and again began banging his head on the cage and making threats to spit on the officer. A spit hood was placed over the suspect's head to prevent the officer from being assaulted. He was charged with Disorderly Conduct and No Alcohol on Streets or Beach.

May 10, 2008 An officer on bike patrol on Ocean Boulevard observed a male subject sleeping on a bench with a lawn sprinkler spraying water on him. The subject was awakened by the officer and determined to be intoxicated. He was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct and No Sleeping on Beach then transported to the Detention Center.

May 10, 2008 An officer met with a Property Manager at a Wild Dunes condominium where he reported that a customer had written checks and charged over \$8,000 for room charges, which were declined by the credit card company and bank. An Investigator was assigned the case and after sending certified letters to the suspect with no response, arrest warrants were prepared.

May 11, 2008 An officer responded to a local establishment where an assault had been reported. The officer determined that an unknown male subject who fled the building punched a male subject trying to protect some female friends that were being bothered by the suspect. The suspect was later located and identified and charged with Simple Assault.

May 11, 2008 An officer responded to a residence on Carolina Boulevard where a fire had been reported. The officer emptied his small fire extinguisher on the electrical pool pump with minimal results. Fire Department personnel responded and put the fire out and officers provided traffic control.

May 13, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Morgan Place Drive where a violation of the noise ordinance had been reported. Two young looking subjects were observed carrying a case of beer into the residence with much visible evidence present

that a large quantity of alcohol had been consumed along with the presence of underage persons. The officer gathered the seven subjects present and determined that three were 21 years old and four were underage to consume alcohol. Three subjects were charged with Transfer of Gift to a Minor and four were charged with Underage Possession of Alcohol and one with an additional charge of Simple Possession of Marijuana.

May 16, 2008 Just after 1 A.M., an officer responded to a local convenience store where a taxi driver reported that a male subject who asked to come to the Isle of Palms had no money to pay the \$50 fare. The subject was intoxicated and a computer check indicated that he had five unpaid traffic tickets. He was unable to provide an address where he was staying so he was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct, NRVC 5 counts, and Petit Larceny then transported to the Detention Center.

May 16, 2008 An officer accompanied a Department of Social Services worker to a residence on 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue to conduct an investigation of an assault and to check on the welfare of children present.

May 17, 2008 After stopping a vehicle for speeding on Palmetto Drive the officer determined that the driver was wanted by the North Charleston Police Department for Bench Warrant. He was taken into custody and turned over to a North Charleston police officer.

May 17, 2008 Officers responded to the corner of Grand Pavilion and Fairway Oaks Drive to meet with a female subject, who reported an incident of Criminal Domestic Violence that had just occurred in their vehicle while traveling onto the Isle of Palms. She stated that while she was driving her husband struck her 4 or 5 times in the face and choked her causing her to stop the vehicle several times to maintain control. The officers located the suspect at their Grand Pavilion address and he was arrested and charged with Criminal Domestic Violence and transported to the Detention Center.

May 20, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Ocean Park Court for a female subject who needed medical attention and was unable to get out of bed to unlock the door to allow entry. An officer made forced entry to the main entrance to allow fire department personnel in to render aid until EMS arrived to transport her to the hospital.

May 23, 2008 Just before 10 P.M. and officer on patrol stopped a golf cart occupied by three persons. The officer observed an open bottle of rum and a bottle of hard lemonade in the console while speaking to the occupants. The driver was charged with Operating a Golf Cart After Dark and Underage Possession of Liquor and the other two subjects with Open Container.

May 24, 2008 An officer on foot patrol stopped to investigate a male subject that had fallen. The officer determined that the subject was intoxicated, and then a computer check of the subject indicated that he was wanted in Georgia and by the Summerville Police Department for an outstanding Bench Warrant. Georgia chose not to extradite and the subject was turned over to a Summerville police officer.

May 25, 2008 Just after 2:30 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a vehicle weaving on Palm Boulevard and stopped to investigate. While speaking to the driver the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol coming from the vehicle. After failing several Field Sobriety Tests, the subject was transported to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test where the driver registered a .15% level of alcohol. The driver was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

May 25, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Forest Trail where a domestic dispute had been reported. It was determined that the altercation was not physical. The female in the dispute took the two children from the residence for the evening without further incident.

May 25, 2008 An officer on patrol stopped to investigate after observing a male subject urinating in public on Ocean Boulevard near 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue. The subject was charged with Disorderly Conduct and released to a friend.

May 25, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on 26<sup>th</sup> Avenue, where a domestic dispute had been reported. The officers determined that there had been no assault. The parties were separated and the husband was escorted to a Mount Pleasant hotel for the remainder of the night.

May 28, 2008 An officer responded to the Causeway on Sullivan's Island to assist a Sullivan's Island police officer in the arrest of two persons on a traffic stop.

May 30, 2008 Just after 1 A.M., an officer on patrol on the Connector clocked a vehicle on radar heading toward the Isle of Palms at 123 m.p.h. and locked the radar in at 119 m.p.h. The vehicle was stopped on Ocean Boulevard near 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue and the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol after making contact with the driver. When asked to exit the vehicle to perform several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed, it was determined that the driver was stationed locally in the US Navy. The driver was transported to headquarters, where he submitted to a Datamaster Test and registered a .27% level of alcohol in his system. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center. His command was then notified of his arrest.

May 30, 2008 At the request of the Mount Pleasant Police Department, an officer responded to a residence on Wills Way to assist in a hit and run accident investigation.

May 31, 2008 An officer responded to the boat landing near Breach Inlet to assist a Sullivan's Island police officer who was investigating an incident that occurred in Sullivan's Island jurisdiction where a male subject on a boat had exposed himself to several female subjects. The subject was later located at the Isle of Palms Marina, positively identified and charged by a Sullivan's Island officer.

### **Personnel/Community Relations**

May 5, 2008 Chief Buckhannon received a letter of appreciation from a resident regarding the professionalism exhibited by PFC Thompson while assisting his family with his daughter's wedding reception recently.

May 6, 2008 Sgt. J. Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipes for the 2008 Tri-County Fraternal Order of Police Law Enforcement Memorial at Alhambra Hall in Mount Pleasant.

May 20, 2008 Chief Buckhannon received a letter of appreciation from the Chief of the Goose Creek Police Department thanking Sgt. Usry for lending her time and expertise to their department for a recent mock on-site re-accreditation assessment.

May 30, 2008 Two officers were assigned to the Recreation Department Teen Dance to provide security and traffic control.

May 31, 2008 For the month of May, officers on patrol discovered two businesses and two homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of three hundred five Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or property owners for various violations noted by officers on patrol.

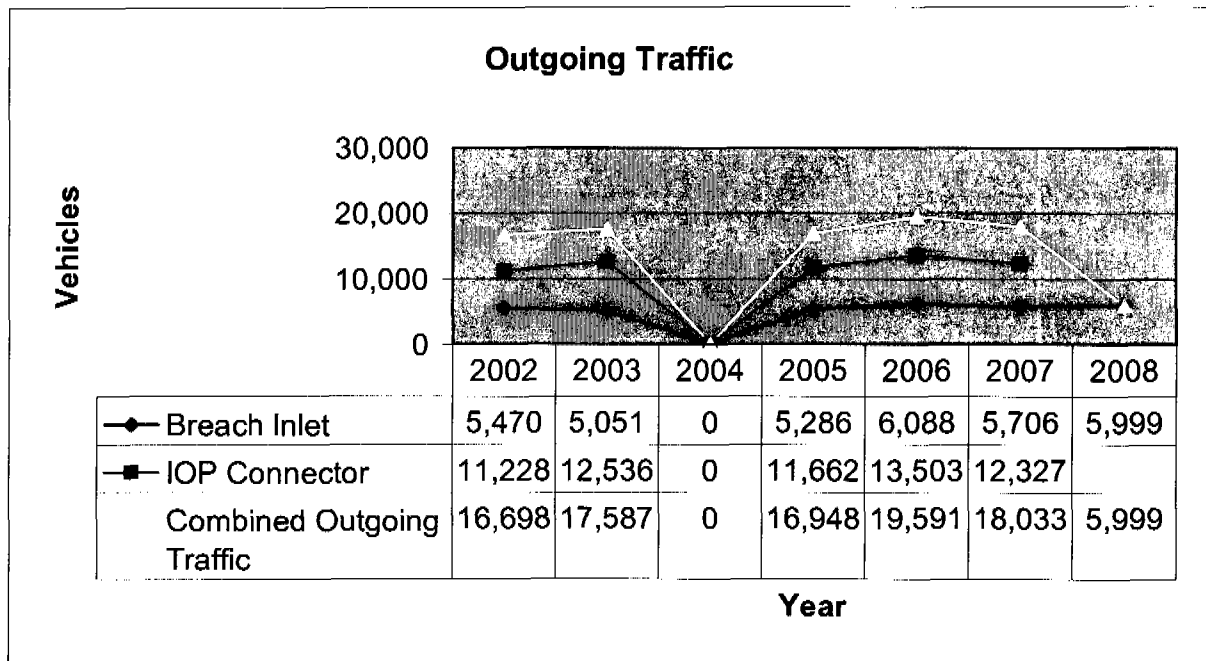
