The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of September.

Saturday, September 1

Disorderly Conduct – 1300 Block Ocean Boulevard @ 11:12am

An officer responded to a report of an intoxicated female who while driving almost struck a family crossing the street. The officer located the female subject who was now out of her car, standing in the road, pulling up her dress to show a bystander her undergarments. The woman was too intoxicated to follow the officer's instructions or to care for herself. The officer was able to get handcuffs on one hand before the female became resistive. The female subject was ultimately placed under arrest and transported to the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, September 2

Driving Under the Influence – 41st Avenue / Waterway Boulevard @ 8:50pm

An officer stopped a golf cart for operating after daylight hours. The officer observed the passenger pour out the contents of her cup before the golf cart stopped. Investigation determined that the beverage the passenger poured out was an alcoholic beverage and she was placed under arrest for open container. Contact with the driver determined that he was possibly under the influence and was provided the opportunity to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs). Concluding the SFSTs, the driver was placed under arrest and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver and passenger were transported to the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Monday, September 3

Domestic Violence – 5800 Block Palmetto Drive @ 12:21am

Officers responded to a report of an intoxicated female subject causing a disturbance. It was determined that the Wild Dunes Manager on Duty would assist in escorting the female subject to the room where she was staying. When they entered the room, they located the female's husband sleeping along with their two children. As officers were leaving, they heard loud yelling, slapping and breaking of items in the room. Upon re-entry into the room they observed broken dishes, food thrown against the

wall and immediately detained the male subject and attempted to detain the female who resisted officers. Investigation determined that the female subject had slapped her husband several times and was determined to be instigating the situation. The female subject was arrested and charged with domestic violence 2nd degree and resisting arrest. She was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Petit Larceny – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard @ 1:00pm

A victim reported that she had left her iPhone in the Public Restrooms and upon returning found that the phone had been taken. The bathroom attendant indicated that he had not seen the phone and it had not been turned in as found property. The approximate value of the item taken is \$449. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Liquor Law Violation – 1400 Block Palm Boulevard @ 10:57pm

An officer stopped a vehicle for disregarding a red light. While speaking with the driver the officer observed in plain view an open bottle of liquor on the front seat. The driver was placed under arrest and a thorough search of the vehicle located three more bottles of liquor, a solo cup containing liquor and four open cans of beer inside the passenger compartment. The driver was charged with failure to obey a traffic control device and unlawful possession of a liquor with broken seal. He was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, September 5

Burglary – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard @ 12:00pm

The manager of a rental property reported that upon inspection of the unit the day after the cleaning company had finished that there three (3) television that had been stolen. The televisions had been mounted to the wall and had been removed by unknown person(s). The approximate value of the stolen items is \$3,500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, September 6

Petit Larceny – Beach / 56th Avenue @ 3:30pm

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen beach chairs that he had left on the beach when he returned to the residence for a few hours. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$160. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, September 8

Disorderly Conduct – 21st Avenue @ 6:16am

Officers responded to a report of a burglary in progress. Prior to arrival they were informed that the subject had fled the scene and was heading towards 20th Avenue. While patrolling the area an officer located a subject that was stumbling down the street and was determined to be intoxicated. The subject admitted that he had entered the wrong house due to being intoxicated but could not remember where he was staying. The subject was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, September 12

Driving Under the Influence – Hwy. 517 / Hwy. 703 @ 11:38pm

An officer stopped a vehicle for disregarding a traffic signal. Contact with the driver determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated that he had consumed 4 or 5 alcoholic beverages. The officer asked the driver to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, which he refused and was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was issued citations for disregarding a traffic signal and DUI and was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Friday, September 14

Underage Possession of Alcohol – Ocean Boulevard / 10th Avenue @ 10:18pm

An officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation. Contact with the driver determined that he was possibly under the influence. During the investigation, the officer determined that the driver was 17 years of age and had an open bottle of liquor on the passenger floorboard. The driver was arrested and charged with underage possession of alcohol, broken seal on liquor, and careless operation. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Tuesday, September 18

Drug / Weapon Violation – 500 Block Carolina Boulevard @ 12:09am

An officer on patrol observed a truck parked at a residential construction site and that the vehicle license plate was expired. The officer checked the vehicle, finding it empty, the hood warm, keys in the ignition and a handgun between the driver's seat and center console. Upon the arrival of additional officers, they searched the area and located the subject hiding in the port-o-let. The subject was arrested, and officers located another handgun inside the port-o-let. The subject stated that the truck belonged to him. Officers searched the vehicle finding another handgun under the passenger's seat, a quantity of methamphetamine, burglary tools and his driver's license was suspended. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, September 19

Warrant Arrest – 34th Avenue Public Beach Access @ 1:07am

Officers patrolling the beach conducted a check of a group of suspicious persons on the beach. The officer checked everyone's information through NCIC with one of the subjects determined to have an active arrest warrant with Charleston County Sheriff's Office for assault and battery 3rd degree. The subject was arrested and transferred to a Deputy with the Sheriff's Office.

Friday, September 21

Petit Larceny – 41st Avenue @ 4:15pm

A victim who drives a taxi did not receive payment for services. The victim drove a subject from the Charleston International Airport to the Isle of Palms Marina Store, at which time the suspect went inside to use the ATM to get cash to pay the fare. After several minutes when the subject did not come back out to pay the victim, he went inside but did not see the subject. When the victim returned to his taxi, the subject's luggage was gone. The approximate amount for the fare is \$77. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, September 22

Driving Under the Influence – 10th Avenue / Palm Boulevard @ 1:44am

An officer on patrol observed a vehicle parked on the right of way with its lights on and the engine running. Contact with the driver determined that he was possibly under the influence. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon their completion he was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing where he failed to provide an adequate breath sample and the test results were registered as a refusal. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 2900 Block Palm Boulevard @ 11:00pm

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered his unlocked vehicle parked in his driveway and stole his handgun from the glovebox. The victim provided the serial number for the handgun, which was entered into NCIC as stolen. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$650. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, September 23

Disorderly Conduct – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard @ 1:22am

An officer on foot patrol observed a male subject running away from a local establishment with the bartender running behind him. Officers detained the subject and determined that he had left without paying his bar tab. The subject was uncooperative with officers, was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Friday, September 28

Petit Larceny – J C Long Boulevard @ 10:30pm

A victim reported that during the evening while out at a local establishment she noticed her iPhone was missing, along with her driver's license, credit cards, car keys, house key and cash. While speaking with the officer, the victim was able to ping her phone to a location in a different jurisdiction. The approximate value of the items taken is \$1,060. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, September 30

Community Service Activities / Notable Mentions

During the month of September 2018, Officers issued 131 "Property Security Check Notices" and 41 "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

September 1 – Detective Sergeant Sharon Baldrick, Sergeant Matthew Storen, FTO Dylan Reynolds and PFC Stephanie Tucker assisted Mount Pleasant Police Department with several Traffic Safety Checkpoints for the Labor Day Weekend as a part of the Sober or Slammer campaign.

September 2 – Detective Sergeant Sharon Baldrick, PFC Daniel Tyson and PFC Stephanie Tucker offered free breath alcohol analyses for patrons of local establishments. During the event, approximately 60 participants were tested and educated about the dangers of driving intoxicated. This event was conducted as part of the Sober or Slammer campaign.

September 7 – 15 – The Police Department began preparations and mobilization as a result of Hurricane Florence. On September 10 Governor McMaster issued a mandatory evacuation order for all South Carolina Coastal Counties. On September 11, Isle of Palms Municipal Emergency Operations Center moved to OPCON 1. Police department staffing was increased to ensure visibility throughout the island. All employees did a great job in preparing and functioning during Hurricane Florence.

September 26 – Detective Louise Hardy and Detective Robert Forsythe participated in Kids & Cops at the IOP Recreation Center with the 3-4-year-old class consisting of about 10 children. They read the book “Officer Buckle and Gloria” to the children and talked about safety. The children shared stories and asked questions.
