The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of April.

Sunday, April 1

Theft from Building – Abalone Alley

A victim reported that while staying at a rental property, her engagement ring and cash had been stolen. The victim reported that the WI-FI for the residence was not working to the rental company, but they were unsure if anyone came to the residence. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$14,100. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, April 2

Simple Assault – Beach Access / Coconut Joe's

A victim reported that as she was walking down the beach access path towards the beach, an unknown female subject began to verbally assault her. When confronted by the victim, the subject stated that she had not said anything. As the victim walked away, the subject again used profanity towards the victim and then the subject struck the victim in the head with a closed fist. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Identity Theft – Seagrass Lane

A victim reported that she received paperwork in the mail from Honda of Chattanooga showing that she had bought an ATV. The victim indicated that she had not been to Chattanooga and does not know anyone there. An unknown subject had used the victim's information to finance the ATV, which is valued at \$16,771. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, April 4

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Ocean Boulevard / Pavilion Drive

A victim reported that she had locked her vehicle and went to the beach. Upon her return, she found her vehicle unlocked and her wallet, which was under the seat had been rummaged through. She reported that her handgun, which was in the glovebox, had been stolen, along with the holster. The victim also reported that her range bag was stolen from the trunk. The victim provided the serial number for the stolen gun, which was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$800. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, April 5

Simple Possession of Marijuana – Beach / Pier at Sea Cabins

An officer patrolling the beach during night shift observed several subjects sitting under the pier. When they saw the officer, they began tossing items and as the officer approached, the odor of marijuana was evident. The officer located a container they had tossed that contained marijuana and one of the subjects indicated it was his. The subjects, who were determined to be juveniles, were arrested and released to their parents.

Friday, April 6

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession of Marijuana – 14th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An officer observed a vehicle stopped in the lane of travel and had white smoke inside. As the officer got behind the vehicle, it drove off and the officer could detect the odor of marijuana. The officer conducted a traffic stop and upon speaking with the driver, admitted to smoking marijuana earlier. A search of the vehicle located a baggie containing a quantity of marijuana. The driver and passenger were arrested and charged with simple possession of marijuana and no driver's license. They were both transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, April 11

Simple Possession of Marijuana – J C Long Boulevard

An officer patrolling on bicycle during night shift smelled marijuana and determined it was coming from the back of a local restaurant. The officer located the subject standing behind a fence near a parked car and asked if he had marijuana. The subject handed him a glass pipe which he had been using. The officer asked if the car belonged to the subject and he stated it was his. The officer could see in plain view marijuana on the car's center console. The subject was issued citations for simple possession of marijuana and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Friday, April 13

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession of Marijuana – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 79MPH in a posted 55MPH speed zone. During contact with the occupants, the officer smelled marijuana emitting from the vehicle. After speaking with each occupant, the officer searched the vehicle and located a baggie containing the marijuana. Two of the occupants were issued citations for simple possession of marijuana and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia with a court date in the County Magistrate Court. The other two occupants were charged and released to their parents due to them being juveniles.

Saturday, April 14

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession of Marijuana – IOP Connector

An officer participating in the Traffic Safety Checkpoint was in the process of checking a driver's license, which the driver did not have with him. Further investigation found a rolled up joint, which had been burned was located in the driver's side door. A search of the vehicle located a glass jar of marijuana on the passenger front floor board. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Thursday, April 19

Traffic Stop / Narcotics Violation – Palmetto Drive / Dunecrest Lane

An officer following behind a vehicle could smell marijuana emitting from the vehicle in front of him. He conducted a traffic stop and saw the driver spraying air freshener inside her vehicle. When asked where the marijuana was located, the driver pointed to the door pocket and said it was in there. The subject was placed under arrest. During a search of the vehicle the officer located an open bottle of wine, drug paraphernalia, a container with 15 mini baggies containing a white powdery substance, and a baggie containing three pills imprinted with \$100 and the Porsche logo. The white powdery substance field tested positive for cocaine and the pills were identified as Ecstasy. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Saturday, April 21

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession of Marijuana – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 78MPH in a posted 55MPH speed zone. While attempting to stop the vehicle, the officer observed the driver throw a bag out of the window. When the vehicle finally stopped, the driver, when asked what he threw out the window said, "not really anything". A Mount Pleasant Police Department K-9 officer assisted by having his canine perform a sniff of the vehicle and alerted to the smell of drugs. A search of the vehicle revealed a container with marijuana. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, April 22

Public Intoxication – 1000 Block Carolina Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of an intoxicated subject that had entered a residence uninvited and had passed out in the bathroom. Officers were able to wake up the intoxicated subject, who was found with his head in the toilet bowl. The subject was unable to tell the officers where he was staying and did not have his cell phone with him. The officers determined that the subject was under the age of 21, was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Possession of False Identification – Beach / 2nd Avenue Access

Officers responded to a male subject who was passed out in the dunes near the beach access path. Officers located the subject and after several attempts were able to get him awake. The subject had a cold beer can in his pocket and two identifications, one being fake, showing him to be 21 years old, when in fact he was only 19. The subject was arrested and charged with public intoxication, possession of fake identification card, minor in possession of beer and sleeping on the beach. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Suicide – Attempted – IOP Connector

Officers responded to a report of a female subject sitting on the edge of the IOP Connector at the top of the crest. The officers determined that the subject needed mental health assistance. While attempting to talk the subject and get her to a safe area, she spun around to put her legs over the side when an officer grabbed her, pulling her down to the concrete road for safety. It was determined that the subject had weights secured to her ankles and wrists. The subject was transported for medical treatment.

Traffic Stop / Narcotics Violation – Ocean Boulevard / 7th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was suspended. When asked, the driver admitted to having marijuana in the driver's side door. The driver was issued citations for driving under suspension and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Tuesday, April 24

Grand Larceny – 29th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown persons stole his 2005 18-foot Key West Boat and trailer from his driveway, which was not secured with a lock. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$15,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, April 25

Credit Card Fraud – 5th Avenue

A victim reported that a subject had made unauthorized purchases on his credit card totaling over \$2,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Driving Under Suspension – Carolina Boulevard / 9th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for a having an expired vehicle license. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was suspended. The driver was issued a citation for DUS 2nd offense and expired vehicle license with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Saturday, April 28

Domestic Violence – 5th Avenue Beach Access

Officers responded to a report of a vehicle backed down the emergency beach access and contacted two males and a female subject. The female subject had a cut on her nose, under her eye and had red marks on her neck. Further investigation revealed that one of the male subjects, identified as her boyfriend, had dragged her out of the vehicle by her hair and they began to argue and have a physical confrontation. The male subject was arrested, charged with domestic violence 2nd degree and providing false information to officers. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center. The driver of the vehicle was issued a citation for driving on the beach access and given a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Sunday, April 29

Driving Under Suspension – 30th Avenue / Waterway Boulevard

A driver stopped a vehicle for speeding, 31MPH in a posted 25MPH speed zone. Contact with the driver determined that her driver's license was suspended for habitual offender. The driver was arrested and charged with DUS – Habitual offender (5th offense for DUS) and operating uninsured. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Traffic Stop / Underage Possession of Alcohol – Breach Inlet / Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 47MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. Contact with the driver allowed the officer to see beer in plain view. The age of the driver was confirmed as being under 21 years old. The driver was issued citations for speeding and minor in possession of beer with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Monday, April 30

Forgery / Counterfeiting – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that an unknown subject cashed a check that had been photo shopped from an employee's paycheck. The check was made out to an unknown subject in the amount of \$650. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Community Service Activities / Notable Mentions

During the month of April 2018, Officers issued one hundred one (101) "Property Security Check Notices" and ten (10) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

SafeWise recently released reports that named the City of Isle of Palms the #1 Safest City in the State and the #48 Safest City in the Nation based on information compiled from the most recent FBI crime data provided by the Department from 2016 used to analyze and rank the cities on their list.

April 11 – Sergeant Matt Storen and FTO Dylan Reynolds attended the SC Law Enforcement Network 2017 DUI Enforcement Recognition Ceremonies. The Isle of Palms Police Department was awarded the Gold Leve in the 2017 Law Enforcement DUI Challenge. Sergeant Matt Storen received the DUI Bronze Hero Award for making between 10 -24 DUI arrests.

April 13 – The Police Department and City recognized Chief Buckhannon on his retirement after 37 years of service with an inspection of his officers as his final act as Chief and an escort from the island at the end of his shift. Captain Usry was appointed as Interim Chief of Police by City Council.

April 14 – Sergeant Chad King, FTO Dylan Reynolds, Ptl Stephanie Tucker and Ptl Thomas Molino assisted Mount Pleasant Police Department with a Traffic Safety Checkpoint at the IOP Connector near Riviera Drive as a part of the Mother's Against Drunk Driving statewide enforcement blitz.

April 16 – Detective Louise Hardy met with the students at Chesterbrook Academy to talk to the children about safety and how police officers help people. The children got to see inside the police car and see the equipment officers use when they are working. There were approximately 100 students from ages 2 to 5. A Charleston City Police Officer was also in attendance.

April 20 – FTO James Taylor assisted a citizen from Matthews, SC with the installation, inspection and education of a child safety seat.

April 21 – FTO James Taylor and FTO Dylan Reynolds assisted the Mount Pleasant Fire and Isle of Palms Fire Department with a child car seat installation / check station event at the Tanger parking lot at Long Grove Road. During the event IOP Officers completed fifteen car seat installations.
