The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of July.

Tuesday, July 4

Petit Larceny – 1300 Block Ocean Boulevard on the Beach

A victim reported that while she was on the beach, unknown persons stole her cooler containing her cell phone, driver's license and prescription medications. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$520. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, July 5

Simple Possession Marijuana - 3100 Block of Waterway Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 37MPH in a posted 25MPH speed zone. During contact with the driver, the officer detected the odor of marijuana. When asked, the driver admitted to having marijuana in her purse, along with drug paraphernalia. The driver was arrested and issued citations for the violations.

Identity Theft – 500 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that she was contacted by Life Lock and advised that unknown persons attempted to open an account in her name with Charles Schwab Bank in Denver, Colorado. The victim reported that she had not authorized anyone to open an account. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, July 6

Petit Larceny - 5800 Block Grand Pavilion Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons stole an iPhone from a gym bag while they were playing tennis. The approximate value of the item is \$700. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, July 8

Warrant Arrest - 14th Avenue

An officer responded to the County Park area for a report of several subjects causing a disturbance. Upon locating the subjects, it was determined that one of them had an outstanding arrest warrant with Dorchester County Sheriff's Office for a Family Court Bench warrant. The subject was arrested and released to the Dorchester County Sheriff's Office.

Vandalism -5700 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that an unknown person operating a golf cart drove up to the gate arm at the rear entrance to Wild Dunes and lifted the gate arm up, breaking it off the control box to gain entry. The approximate value of the damage caused is \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Open Container in Vehicle – 57th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation and upon making contact with the driver, observed an open container of an alcoholic beverage on the rear driver's side floorboard. The driver was arrested and issued a citation.

Simple Possession Marijuana - 57th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An officer got out to check on a suspicious vehicle parked along the side of the road. The officer immediately detected the smell of marijuana when contact was made with the occupants in the vehicle. Additionally, the officer observed several open containers of alcoholic beverages. The occupants were arrested and issued citations.

Sunday, July 9

Weapon Law Violation - 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a male subject who had fired a handgun towards a crowd in front of a local establishment. It was determined that the subject who fired the gun had left the area. A description of his vehicle was provided to local agencies and he was located by Mt. Pleasant Police Department. The subject had barricaded himself inside his truck. Mt. Pleasant Police were able to take the subject into custody and released him to our officers. The subject was arrested and charged with disorderly conduct, discharging a firearm in City limits, pointing a firearm and discharging a firearm at or into occupied structures after conferring with the Charleston County Solicitor's Office.

Simple Assault - 56th Avenue

Officers responded to a report of an assault. On arrival, officers met with the victim, who sustained a laceration above his eye and another victim who had a fat lip. As officers attempted to get information from the victims, they became uncooperative making it difficult to details. Officers were able to provide a description of a possible suspect. A review of officer video/audio, it was determined that the victim possibly knew who assaulted him, but continued to refuse to cooperate. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Harassing Phone Calls – 2500 Block Cameron Boulevard

A victim reported that a known subject had been sending him threatening text messages. This has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, July 10

Disorderly Conduct - 1300 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer responded to investigate a collision of a golf cart striking a parked vehicle. During the investigation, the officer found an open container of beer in the golf cart. The driver of the golf cart was arrested for public intoxication, open container and operating uninsured vehicle.

Tuesday, July 11

Disorderly Conduct - 900 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of a possible intoxicated driver. The officer located the vehicle, which was parked and the driver was still inside. During the investigation, the officer saw an open bottle of vodka on the front passenger floor board. The driver was arrested for public intoxication and broken seal on liquor bottle.

Burglary - 100 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons had stolen tools from a residence that was having construction renovations done. The items stolen were an air compressor, optical leveling transit, and other hand tools. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$1000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u> – Palm Boulevard / 3rd Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 47MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. Further investigation revealed that the driver's license was suspended. The driver was arrested and issued a citation.

Friday, July 14

Vandalism - 4700 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer on patrol heard loud screaming and yelling coming from subjects near the side of the road. The officer made contact with the subjects and immediately one of them said "I don't care, take me to jail"! The officer determined that the subject was intoxicated and after he was placed in handcuffs continued to pull away from the officer. Further investigation revealed that the subject had an argument with a family member and then smashed a mailbox at a nearby residence. The subject was arrested and charged with damage to property and public disorderly conduct.

Saturday, July 15

Disorderly Conduct - 41st Avenue

Officers responded to a local restaurant for a fight in progress. An officer located a subject involved in the fight walking away. It was determined that the subject was intoxicated and he refused to provide any information to the officer. The subject was arrested for public disorderly conduct.

Sunday, July 16

<u>Liquor Law Violations</u> – Palm Boulevard / 3rd Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 54MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. While speaking with the driver, the officer smelled marijuana, which the driver admitted to smoking earlier. A search of the vehicle found an open bottle of tequila under the front passenger seat. The passenger in the vehicle was arrested for broken seal of liquor.

Simple Possession Marijuana - 2900 Block Waterway Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 36MPH in a posted 25MPH speed zone. While speaking with the driver, the officer smelled marijuana, which the driver admitted to having it inside the driver's door pocket. The driver was arrested for simple possession of marijuana and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia.

Wednesday, July 19

Simple Possession Marijuana – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 69MPH in a posted 55MPH speed zone. While speaking with the driver, the officer detected the odor of marijuana coming from within the vehicle. When asked, the driver admitted to having marijuana and drug paraphernalia inside the center console. The driver was arrested and charged with simple possession of marijuana and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia.

Friday, July 21

Warrant Arrest - 1300 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer was requested to located a subject with an outstanding arrest warrant with Charleston County Sheriff's Office for a Family Court Bench warrant. The subject was located, arrested and transferred to the Charleston County Sheriff's Office.

Tuesday, July 25

Simple Possession Marijuana – 2200 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer on patrol got out with a suspicious vehicle parked in a handicap parking space and located two occupants. While speaking with the subjects, the officer detected an odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. A search of the vehicle found the marijuana and an open bottle of liquor. The owner of the vehicle was arrested and charged with simple possession of marijuana and broken seal on liquor bottle.

Friday, July 28

Driving Under the Influence - 700 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 48MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. Further investigation revealed that the driver was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver admitted to drinking 2 beers. The officer asked the driver to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and after the test, she was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center for Datamaster Testing, where she provided a breath sample with a result of .10% BAC. The driver was charged and lodged at the detention center.

Saturday, July 29

Theft from Building – J C Long Boulevard

A victim reported that a customer stole several pieces of artwork and décor from the bathroom located inside the restaurant. When the subject left the restaurant, carrying a bag, the victim confronted her and asked to look inside the bag. The subject refused and got into a vehicle, leaving the area. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Motor Vehicle - 30th Avenue

A victim reported that he left his handgun inside the center console of his truck and the next morning discovered it was missing. The serial number was provided and it was entered into the National Crime Information Center (NCIC). The approximate value of the stolen item is \$800. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, July 31

Theft from Buildings – 900 Block Ocean Boulevard

The victim reported that unknown persons had stolen two of the rental bicycles from a rental property. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.
