The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of November.

## Thursday, November 2

### Motor Vehicle Theft – Lake Village Lane

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his golf cart from the driveway area outside his residence. The suspect(s) left the golf cart cover on the ground near where it had been parked. The approximate value of the stolen golf cart is \$3,000. At the time of the report, the victim was not able to provide a vehicle identification number, so it could not be entered into NCIC. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

## Saturday, November 4

### Unlawful Possession of Drug Paraphernalia – Palm Boulevard / 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. While speaking with the driver, the officer observed a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. When asked, the driver admitted to having a bowl and grinder that contained marijuana in his back pack which was on the front seat. The items were located and contained only trace amounts of actual marijuana. The driver was arrested and issued citations for unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia with a court date in the IOP Municipal Court.

## Sunday, November 5

### Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / Hwy. 517

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 53MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. Upon contacting the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of the testing, was placed under arrest for driving under the influence. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was also charged with driving under suspension and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Monday, November 6**

#### **Petit Larceny** – 4000 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his Masterbuilt smoker from the behind his residence. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$189. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### **Petit Larceny** – 400 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered the residential construction site after hours where the victim had been working and stole various construction tools and a roll of carpet that was to be installed. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$1,340. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Wednesday, November 8**

#### **False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game** – 400 Block Merritt Boulevard

A victim reported that while attempting to sell an item on Craigslist, he was contacted by a potential buyer who made an offer on the item and included an additional \$1,600 to cover shipping costs. The victim received a check in the amount of \$4,800 and deposited, waiting for it to clear the bank. The suspect instructed the victim to wire the \$1,600 to a location in Florida. Ultimately, the bank did not clear the amount of \$4,800, but the victim had already wired the \$1,600. The amount stolen from the victim is \$1,600. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Friday, November 10**

#### **Petit Larceny** – Cameron Boulevard / 28<sup>th</sup> Avenue

An officer observed a subject get out of his vehicle and begin pulling up campaign signs for an active candidate. The officer observed the subject to not remove campaign signs for other candidates, but for the same candidate each time. When approached, the subject indicated the he liked to use the signs for target practice. The victim was contacted to confirm that he had not given anyone permission to remove any of his campaign signs and the victim indicated that he wanted to pursue charges. The subject was arrested, issued a citation for unlawful removal of campaign sign and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Monday, November 13**

#### **Disorderly Conduct** – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of a subject passed out under a bench in front of a local grocery store. It took the officer several attempts to wake up the subject. While trying to determine where the subject was staying, the subject refused to cooperate and was arrested for disorderly conduct. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Thursday, November 16**

#### **Motor Vehicle Theft** – Sandcrab Court

A Mt. Pleasant Police Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle that was towing a trailer with a golf cart bearing a Wild Dunes sticker. Due to the suspicious nature, the officer contacted IOPPD to have a unit verify the status of the golf cart. It was determined that the golf cart had been stolen from the

residence. The approximate value of the stolen golf cart is \$3,000. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Saturday, November 18**

#### **Traffic Offense – DUS – Palm Boulevard / 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue**

An officer stopped a vehicle for a vehicle license violation. Contact with the driver showed that the driver's license was suspended, the vehicle was not registered with SCDMV and the vehicle was not insured. The driver was arrested and charged with DUS 4<sup>th</sup> Offense, Operating Uninsured Motor Vehicle, and failure to register a motor vehicle. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### **Traffic Offense – Reckless Driving – Breach Inlet Bridge**

While conducting stationary radar, the officer observed a vehicle traveling 49MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. As the vehicle continued towards the officer, the vehicle accelerated to 60MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. The officer attempted to stop the vehicle, the vehicle attempted to travel through a residential area to evade the officer. The driver stopped and the officer conducted a high-risk traffic stop, ordering the driver to exit the vehicle, with the driver refusing, holding onto the steering wheel. The officer was able to remove the driver and placed him under arrest for reckless driving. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Sunday, November 19**

#### **Driving Under the Influence – 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue / Palm Boulevard**

An officer stopped a vehicle for moving violations. Contact with the driver determined that he was possibly under the influence. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. The driver was only able to complete one of the three tests before refusing to complete any further tests. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing. The driver provided a breath sample that resulted in a .23% BAC. The driver was charged with DUI 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Monday, November 20**

#### **Petit Larceny – 100 Block of Charleston Boulevard**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) went through his mail, opened a package and stole an Apple iPad 3. The victim was able to provide the serial number for the item, which was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the item was \$139. The case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Tuesday, November 21**

#### **Fraud / Identity Theft – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) made unauthorized charges on her credit card in the amount of \$800. Additionally, it was reported that unknown person(s) were attempting to use the victim's Social Security Number to apply for additional credit cards. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### **Motor Vehicle Theft – Twin Oaks Lane**

A victim reported that after being away for several weeks found that unknown person(s) had stolen her golf cart from her residence. The victim provided the Vehicle Identification Number and the golf cart

was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the stolen golf cart is \$5,5000. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Saturday, November 25**

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle** – 2900 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered his unlocked truck and stole a handgun from the glove box. The victim was unable to provide a serial number for the handgun at the time of the report. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$350. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle** – 2900 Block Skinner Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered his unsecured vehicle. The victim was unable to determine if anything had been taken. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered both of his unlocked vehicles and stole approximately \$550 in cash. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Sunday, November 26**

#### **Simple Assault** – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of an assault at a local establishment. Investigation revealed that a male subject had sat down to talk with a female when another male subject approached and punched him in the face. The subject who had been punched then punched the other male subject in the mouth. Due to conflicting information and subjects not fully cooperating, this case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle** – 2400 Block Cameron Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered her locked vehicle by unzipping the back window. The victim was unable to determine if anything had been taken. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Monday, November 27**

#### **Fraud / Identity Theft** – Morgans Cove Court

A victim reported that unknown person(s) made numerous unauthorized withdrawals from her account to pay credit cards, student loans and other various bills. The victim contacted her bank who began an investigation and closed her account. The amount stolen is approximately \$10,000. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle** – 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered both unlocked vehicles and stole a back pack and a handgun. The victim was able to provide the serial number for the handgun and it was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$400. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wire/Computer/Other Electronic Manipulation – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that a known person attempted to use funds from his business account to pay for services with Comcast Corporate Cable that were not authorized. The amount of funds attempted to be stolen was \$416. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Personnel Recognition

Command Staff recognizes the following personnel:

Sergeant Jamey Meekins, FTO Dylan Reynolds, Pfc. Daniel Tyson and Ptl. Karina Garcia for their professionalism during a critical incident where a domestic disturbance was reported and the subjects inside the residence refused to acknowledge the officers. The officers quickly established a perimeter, made appropriate notifications and stood by until additional officers could respond. They then worked efficiently with the Charleston County Sheriff's Office SWAT and Negotiations Team to work toward getting the occupants to exit safely. Due to their diligence and persistence during this critical incident, all involved were kept safe.

Communicational Specialist Melissa Dawson for her professionalism and determination to assist the officers involved with the critical incident locate contact information and additional family members. Her actions provided the officers on scene with alternative methods to attempt communication with the subjects inside the residence.

Community Service Activities

During the month of November 2017, Officers issued eighty-four (84) "Property Security Check Notices" and fifteen (15) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

November 21 – FTO Amanda Postell assisted a visitor with the installation and inspection of a child safety seat. FTO Postell provided education regarding the child safety seat, ensuring that the citizen was familiar and comfortable with removing and installing the child safety seat.
