The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of October.

Thursday, October 1

Grand Larceny – 300 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole patio chairs from the pool area at the residence. The value of the property is approximately \$2,400. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, October 2

Assault / Kidnapping – Morgans Cove Drive

A victim reported that her boyfriend attacked her, causing physical injuries and physically restrained her, not allowing her to leave the residence. She was able to escape, contact the police. Officers responded, located the subject, placed him under arrest and transported him to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, October 3

Petit Larceny – 25th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a patio chair from the front porch area at the residence. The value of the property is \$125. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 53rd Avenue

An Officer responded to a report of a vehicle with its passenger side tire missing, driving on the rim. The Officer located the vehicle, observed that it was swerving and conducted a traffic stop. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked if he had been drinking, the driver stated that he had nothing to drink. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of the testing was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he provided a breath sample with at .18% BAC. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Tuesday, October 6

Petit Larceny – 500 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his iPhone after it was left outside near the residence. The value of the property is approximately \$450. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, October 7

Grand Larceny – 2600 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen several pieces of silver flatware sets and had made unauthorized charges on her debit card. The total value of the items stolen is approximately \$17,750. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, October 9

Petit Larceny – 41st Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a cooler from his boat. The value of the property is approximately \$300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Traffic Stop / Open Container – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended driver's license and an open container of an alcoholic beverage in the center console. The driver was arrested and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, October 10

Disorderly Conduct – Yacht Harbor Court

Officers responded to a report of a female subject running in the street with a wine bottle, only wearing a t-shirt. The female subject had been banging on doors and screaming. She was located on a boat in the area. Further investigation revealed that the female was intoxicated, yelling profanities and would not cooperate with the Officers. The subject was arrested and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Warrant Arrest – Lagoon Road

An Officer responded to a residence in reference to a verbal dispute. Further investigation revealed that one of the subjects involved in the dispute had an outstanding arrest warrant for failure to appear in court with a local agency. The subject was arrested and released to the Dorchester County Sheriff's Office.

Sunday, October 11

Petit Larceny – IOP Connector

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen his wallet that had fallen from his vehicle onto the road. The wallet was located, but his debit card and approximately \$100 was missing. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Vandalism – 4000 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) shot an arrow at his rear garage window, causing it to break. The value of the damage is approximately \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Disorderly Conduct – Yacht Harbor Court

Officers responded to report of an intoxicated female who was yelling and using profanity in public. Officers located the subject and had her sit on the curb while investigating the incident. The female subject stood up and then took off, running towards her residence. Officers ordered her to stop and she struck one of the Officers with a closed fist in the face. The subject was arrested and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, October 17

Warrant Arrest – 1100 Block Pavilion Drive

An Officer patrolling the area at night observed a vehicle parked at the very back of the empty parking lot. The Officer made contact with the occupants and discovered that they were not fully dressed. Further investigation revealed that the male subject had an outstanding arrest warrant with a local agency for failure to appear in court. The subject was arrested and released to the Mount Pleasant Police Department.

Sunday, October 18

Warrant Arrest – Palm Boulevard / 14th Avenue

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for defective equipment. Further investigation revealed that the driver had an outstanding arrest warrant for failure to appear in court. The subject was arrested and released to the Dorchester County Sheriff's Office.

Petit Larceny – 1100 Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole yard equipment and other power tools located in the garage area. The value of the property stolen is approximately \$350. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, October 19

Vandalism – 28th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had driven across the grass area and accelerated, causing ruts and damage near the basketball courts. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, October 27

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 20th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) went into her unlocked vehicle and stole her book bag from the floorboard. The value of the items is approximately \$300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, October 28

Driving Under the Influence – 22nd Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that she was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver admitted to drinking several glasses of wine. The driver was requested to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing where she refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Friday, October 30

Traffic Offense – 300 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver did not possess a valid driver's license. The driver was arrested and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Warrant Arrest – 300 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that one of the occupants had an outstanding arrest warrant for aggravated assault with another agency in the state. The subject was arrested and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center with a hold placed on him for Greenville City Police Department to make extradition arrangements.

Community Service Mentions

During the month of October 2015, Officers issued three (3) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices and fifty (50) Property Security Check notices.

Officers assisted the IOP Recreation Department with traffic control for the citizens attending the Ghostly Tide Tales on the beach and attended the Halloween Carnival greeting children and their parents and giving candy to all the trick or treaters.

Personnel Recognition

Command Staff recognizes personnel that worked during the Flooding Event that occurred at the beginning of the month. Everyone worked together to shut down roads and establish detours to ensure the safety of the citizens, answered numerous telephone calls about the effects of the flooding and stepped up to assist no matter what the task.

In addition, we recognize the outstanding efforts of Beach Services Officers Skinner and Tyson who have been working on repainting the street markings on the Front Beach. They are also working to repair direction street signs and cutting back any bushes or shrubs that are obstructing the view of pedestrians and motorists in an effort to ensure the safety of our public.

We also recognize Pfc. Dylan Reynolds for his actions on October 7, 2015 when he responded to a medical call on the beach near the Grand Pavilion area. He arrived at the location and assisted IOPFD Captain Eagle, who was beginning medical aid on a visitor who was in cardiac arrest. Pfc. Reynolds retrieved an AED unit from the hotel staff, attached the unit to the subject, and activated the unit. The subject was transported to the hospital and we learned that he was transferred from the ICU Unit and expected to make a full recovery.
