The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of July.

Friday, July 1

Driving Under the Influence – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer conducting a business check on a local convenience store observed a vehicle pull into the parking lot and hit the concrete bollard in front of the building. The officer made contact with the driver and determined that he was possibly under the influence. The officer asked the driver to conduct Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, placed him under arrest. When asked, the driver stated he did not drink because he was the designated driver. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he provided a breath sample with a BAC of .16%. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, July 6

Driving Under the Influence – 500 Block Carolina Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of a trespasser and on arrival observed a vehicle that was parked partially on the road. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that she was possibly under the influence and admitted that she had been drinking. The officer asked the driver to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon completion of the tests, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where she provided a breath sample with a BAC of .18%. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Thursday, July 7

Fraud – Credit Card – 1300 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that his credit card company contacted him in reference to fraudulent charges made at a local establishment without his authorization. The amount charged to the credit card was approximately \$100. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, July 11

Petit Larceny – 700 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered the open garage area of the home and stole a surfboard. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$400. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, July 12

False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game -1500 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that he received a bill appearing to be from a local electric company. The bill indicated that if the unpaid amount were not received by a certain date, the power would be shut down. The victim received a phone call providing instructions to send a money gram to prevent the power from being turned off. The victim followed the instructions, sending a money gram for \$1524. The victim then contacted the power company and determined that was not their normal business practice. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny – 1300 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen his open utility trailer from the parking lot where it was stored. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$800. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny – Beach / 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his beach bag that he had left on the beach. While the bag was unattended, it was taken along with his car keys and other items. While the victim was reporting the theft, someone set off the car alarm while he was standing near his car. The approximate value of the stolen items is approximately \$200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, July 13

Grand Larceny – 7600 Block Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen a set of sterling silver. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$10,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, July 17

Vandalism – 2500 Block Cameron Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had broken the window next to the front door while he was out of town. There was no other damage or items taken. The approximate value of the damage is \$800. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny – 4000 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a large canvas boat cover. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$1,750. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, July 19

Motor Vehicle Theft – 5800 Block Palmetto Drive

Officers responded to a report of a Low Speed Vehicle striking the side of a residence. Further investigation revealed that the LSV had been stolen and after striking the residence, the occupants fled. The damage done to the residence is approximately \$1,000. The approximate value of the stolen LSV is \$10,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Burglary – 200 Block Grand Pavilion Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) attempted to break into the bar area of a local hotel. The officer located pry marks on the window and the doors. The unknown person(s) were unsuccessful in breaking into the area. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation

Wednesday, July 20

Identity Theft/Impersonation – 31st Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) opened a PayPal account in her name without her knowledge or authorization. The approximate amount charged is \$1,219. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, July 21

Burglary – Intracoastal Court

A victim reported that unknown person(s) broke into his residence that was under construction and stole construction equipment. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$950. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Motor Vehicle Theft – 9500 Block Palmetto Drive

An officer on patrol observed a golf cart operated by the subjects identified from a previous motor vehicle theft. The officer attempted to stop them, but the subjects left the vehicle in the middle of the road and fled. Other officers responded and attempted to locate them, but were unsuccessful. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$5,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, July 22

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Lagoon Villas

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his unlocked vehicle and stole money from a purse that was left inside. The amount of money stolen is \$200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, July 23

Motor Vehicle Theft – 400 Block Carolina Boulevard

A citizen reported that when he returned home he saw a blue golf cart parked near the side of his home. Officers were unable to determine the owner at the time and had the vehicle towed. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$3,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Warrant Arrest – Palm Boulevard / 28th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation and seatbelt violations. Upon further investigation, the officer determined that the passenger had an active arrest warrant with the Charleston County Sheriff's Office for a family court violation. The warrant was confirmed; the passenger was arrested and transferred to Charleston County Sheriff's Office.

Motor Vehicle Theft – 700 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that he observed two male subjects steal his golf cart that was parked in his front yard. The victim began chasing the subjects, who abandoned the golf cart and fled. Officers were able to locate subjects in the area matching their description, which was confirmed by the victim. The subjects were identified as being juveniles and were charged as such. This case has been assigned to CID for follow-up investigation.

Burglary – 400 Block Carolina Boulevard

Officers investigating the earlier theft of a golf cart determined that the same subjects were also involved in a burglary to a residence. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Burglary – 600 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into the garage area of the residence and stole a cooler. The stolen item is valued at approximately \$295. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, July 25

Burglary – 2600 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered an unsecured residence by making a hole in the wall through the garage area. The subjects stole multiple televisions and other electronic equipment. The victim was able to provide serial numbers for most of the items. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$27,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, July 27

Petit Larceny – 5800 Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his bicycle that had been parked while he was working and when he returned, the bicycle was gone. The approximate value of the stolen bicycle is \$700. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, July 30

Public Intoxication – Beach / 21st Avenue

An officer patrolling the beach observed a possibly intoxicated subject stumbling down the beach carrying an open container of beer, who walked in front of the officers moving vehicle. Further investigation revealed that the subject was grossly intoxicated. The subject was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Beach Alcohol Enforcement

During the month, Officers patrolled the beach and charged seventeen (17) persons for violating the City's ordinance preventing alcohol on the beach.

Personnel Recognition

Officers received a tremendous show of support from the community through cards, phone calls, emails and dropping off food items for everyone to enjoy.

Community Service Activities

During the month of May 2016, Officers issued sixty-three (63) "Property Security Check Notices" and twelve (12) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

July 6 – Sergeant Matt Storen and Pfc. Amanda Postell participated in the morning session of the IOP Recreation Department's Summer Camp. The officers displayed their assigned vehicles, a Police Bicycle, and instructed the participants on beach, swimming, and biking safety.
